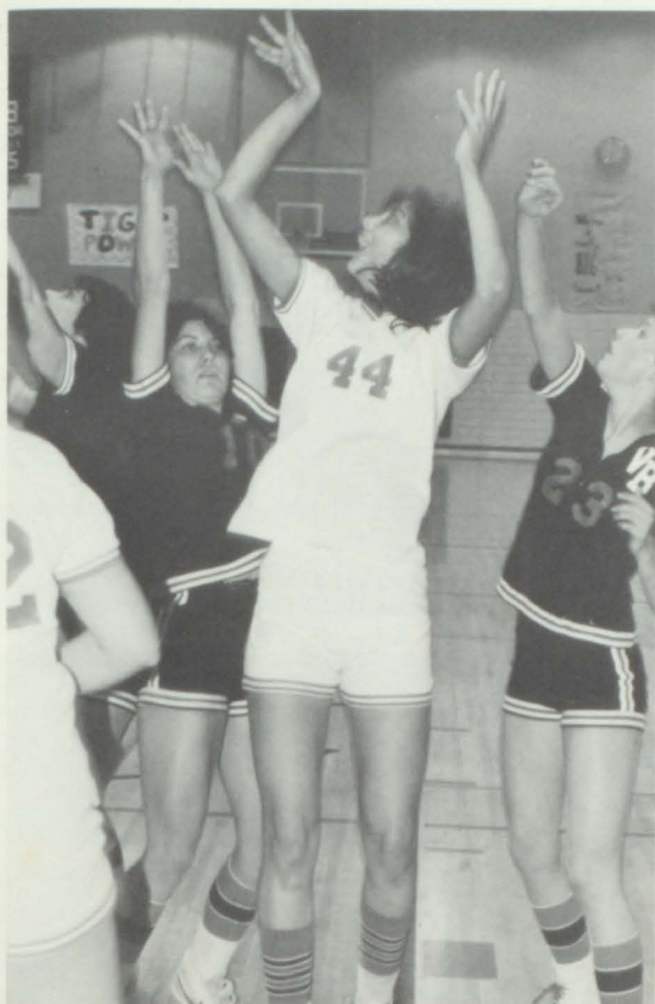
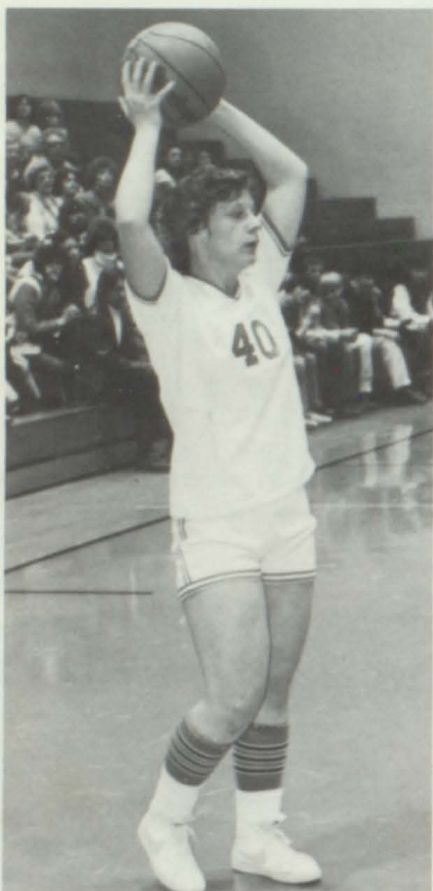
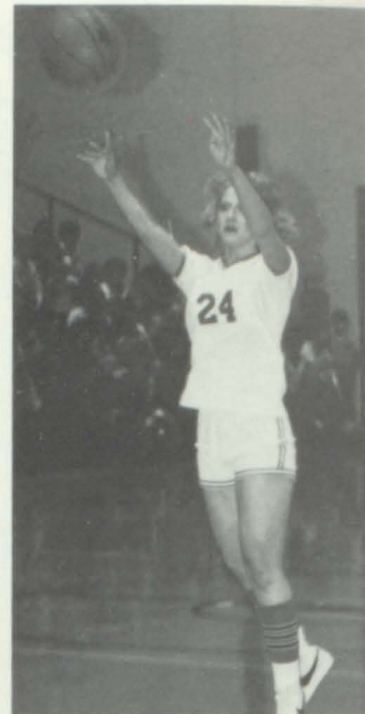
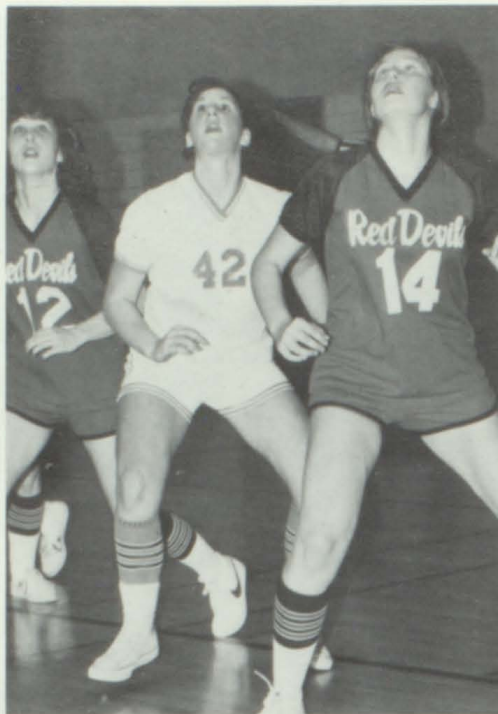
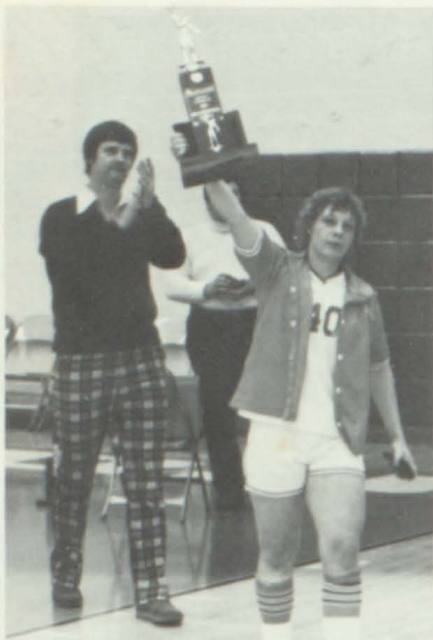


All-State Star Tammy Hillard Paces Tigers



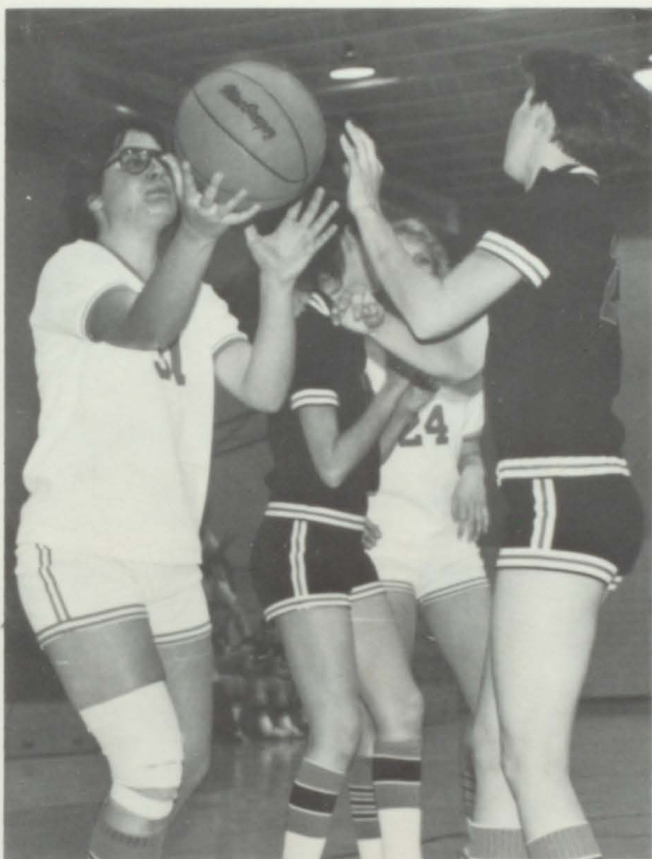

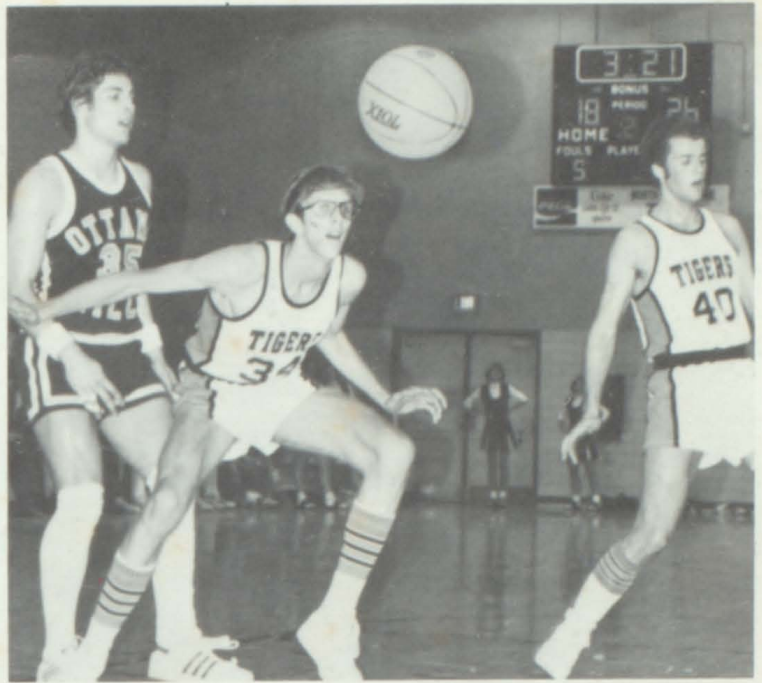

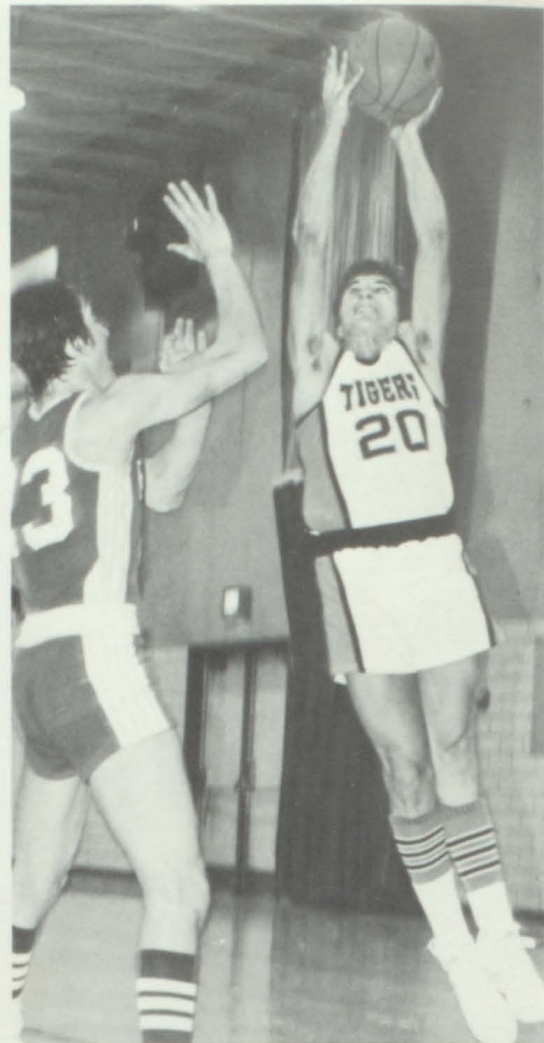
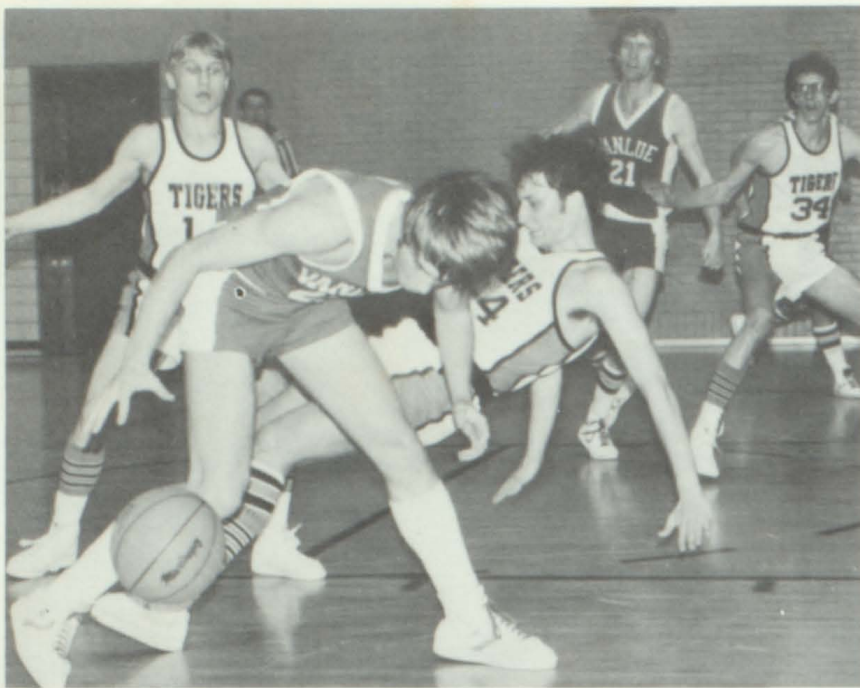

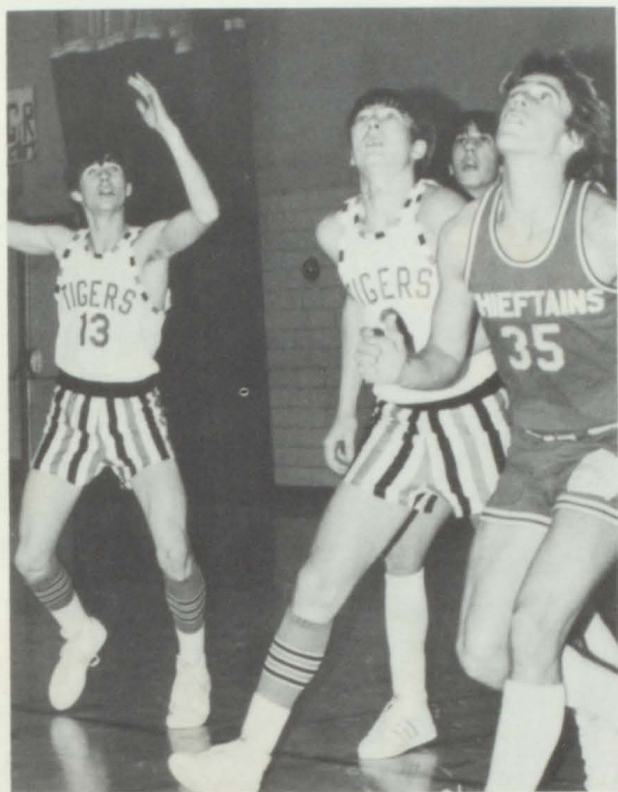

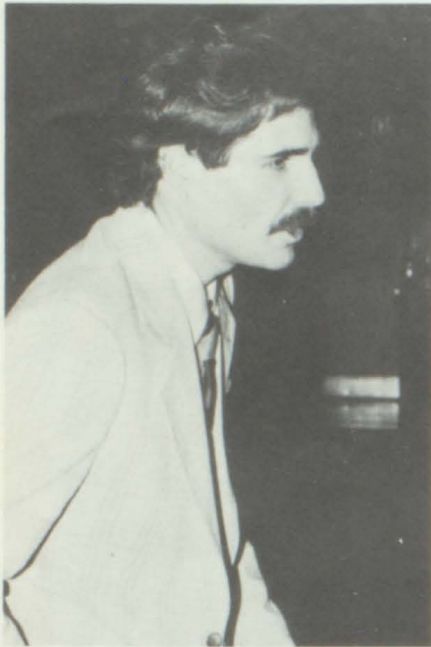
Crippled by season-ending injuries to Lee Burklew and Jim James and injuries that claimed other starters during the season, the Reserves still managed a credible 11-9 record.

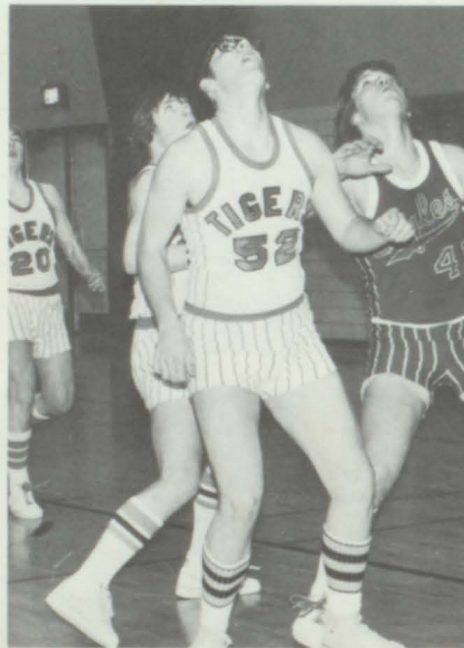

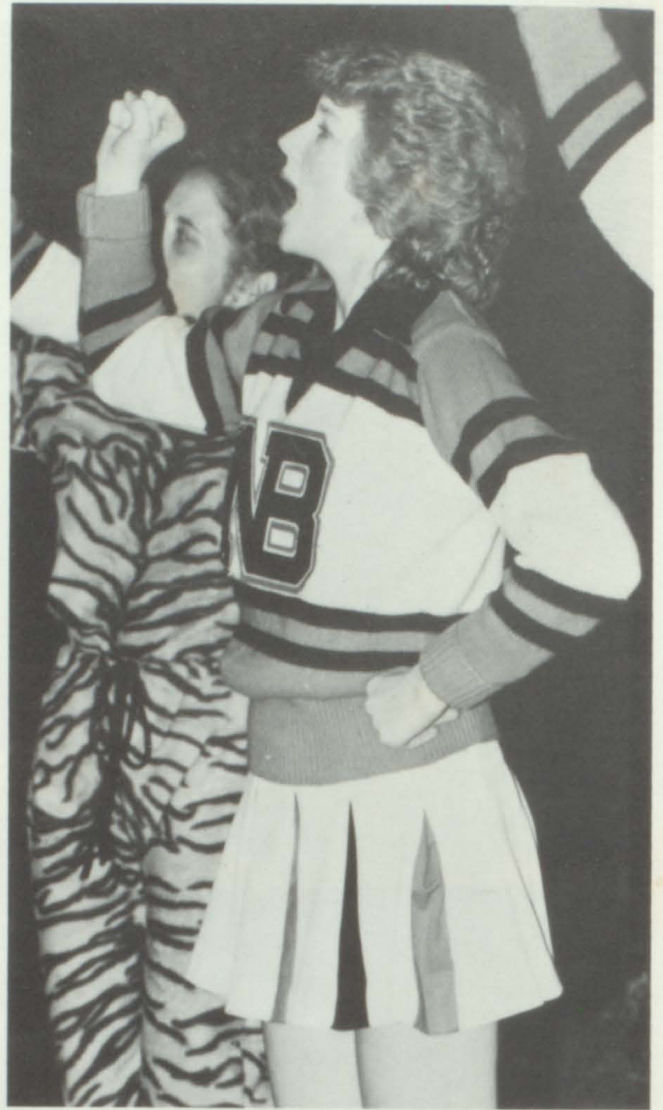

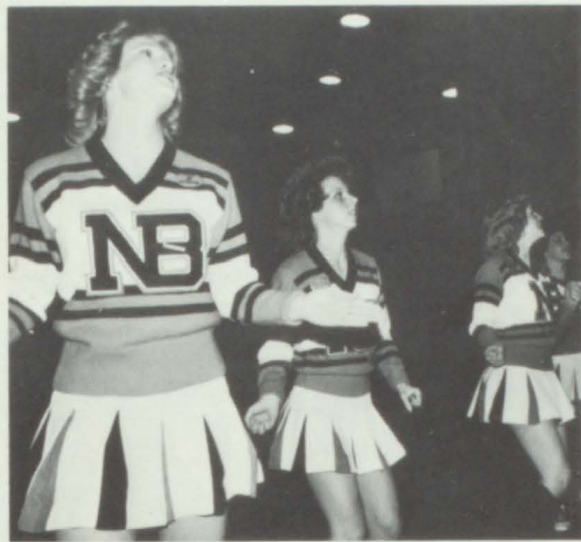
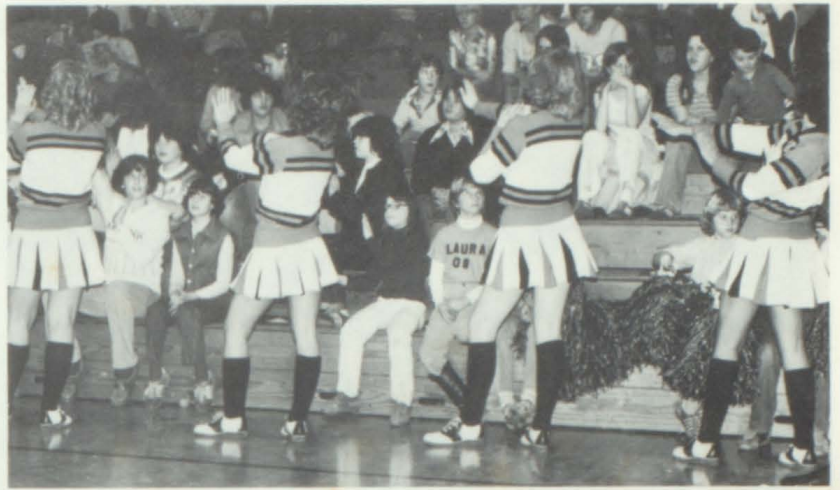
