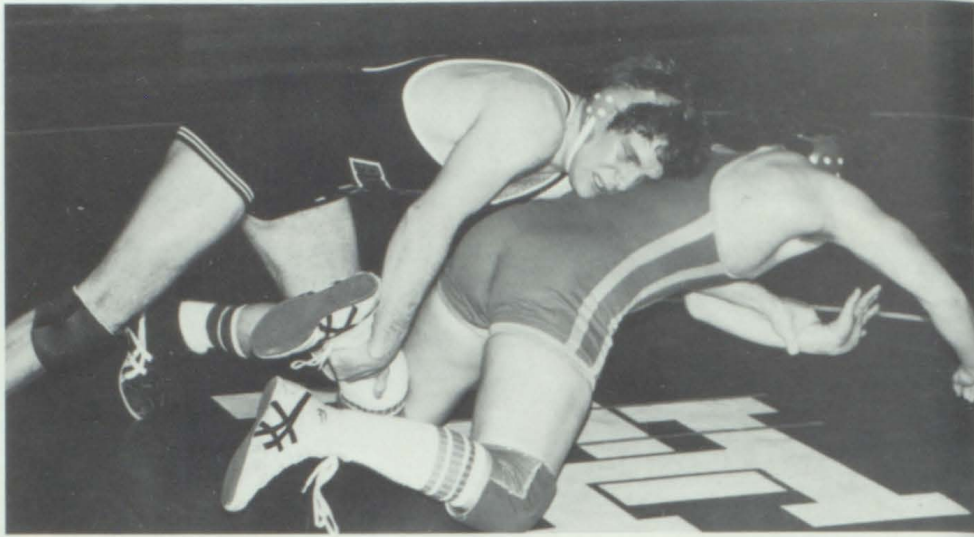

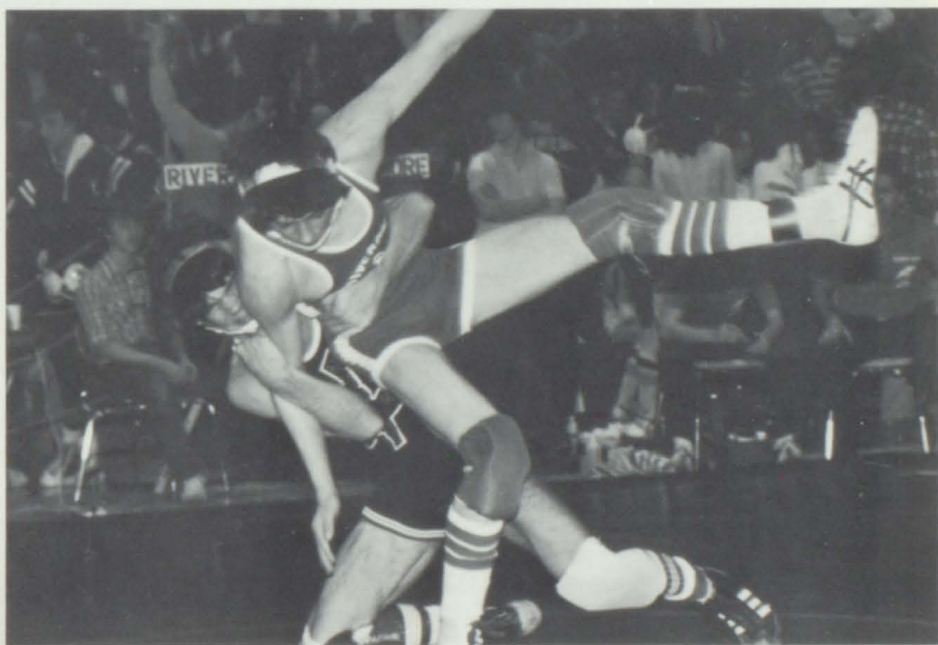
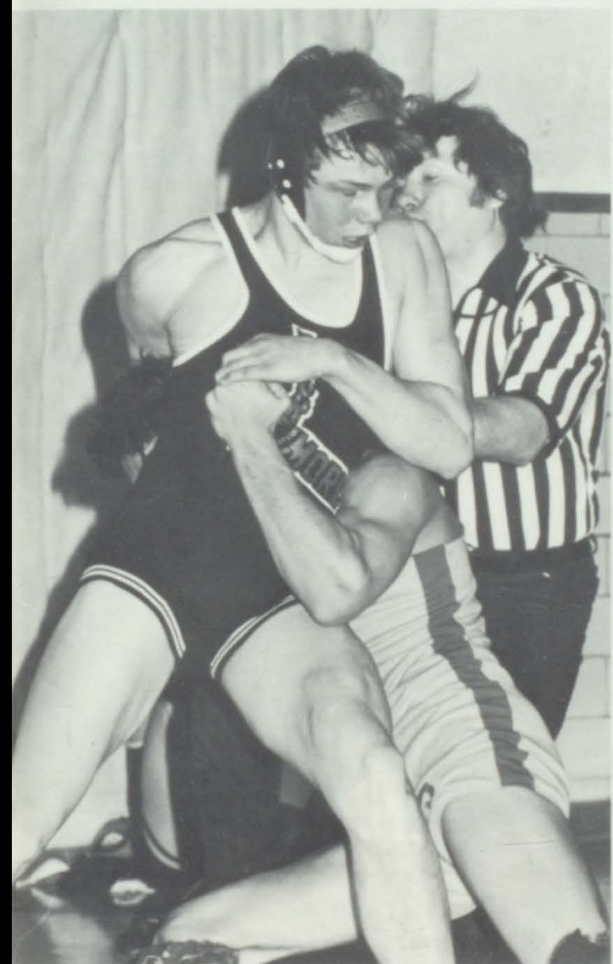
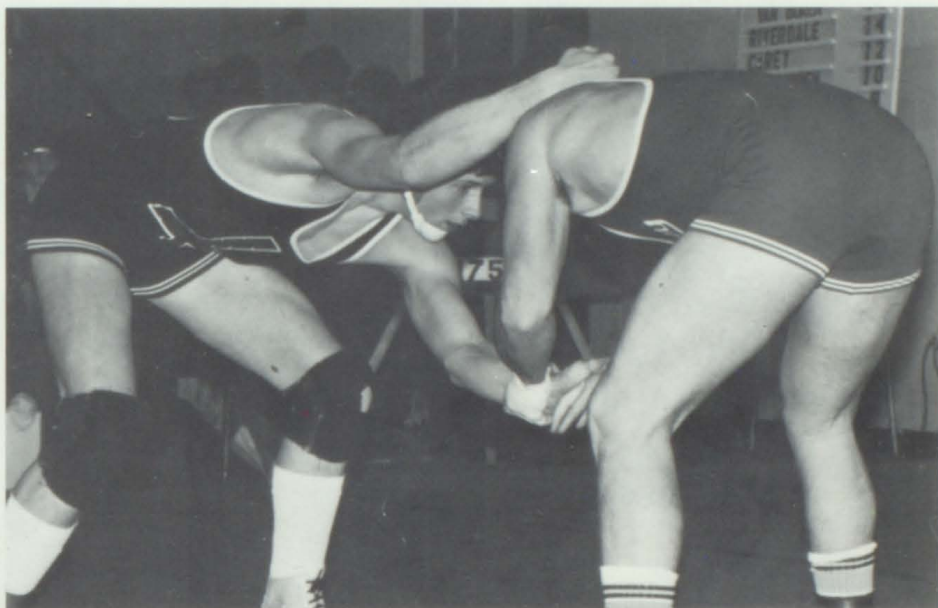
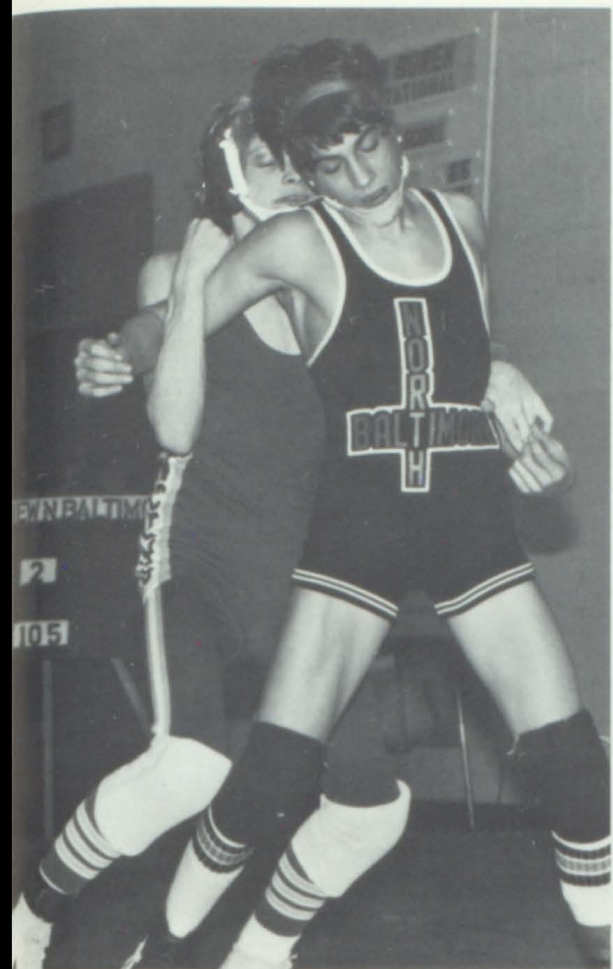

## Baseball Team Suffers Through Disappointing 8-9 Season

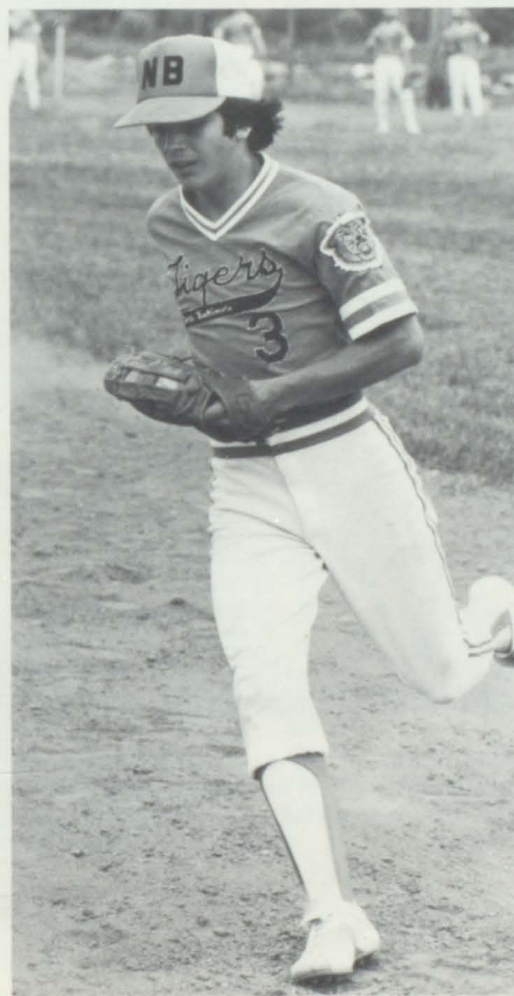

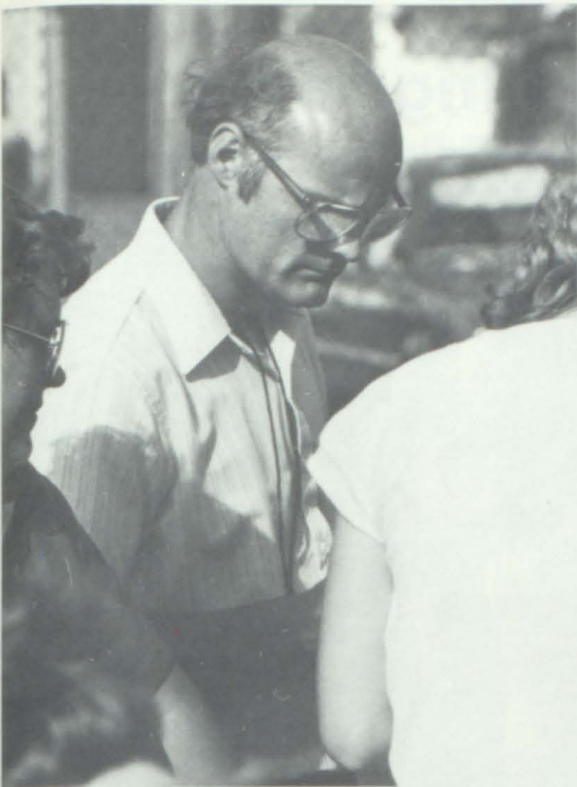

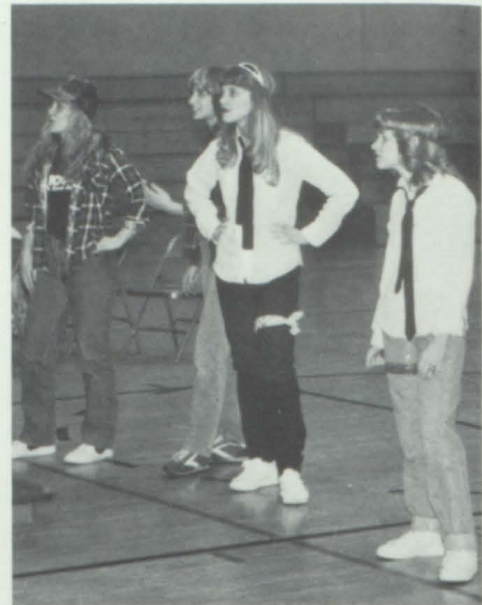

Our apologies to sports fans who were expecting better coverage.

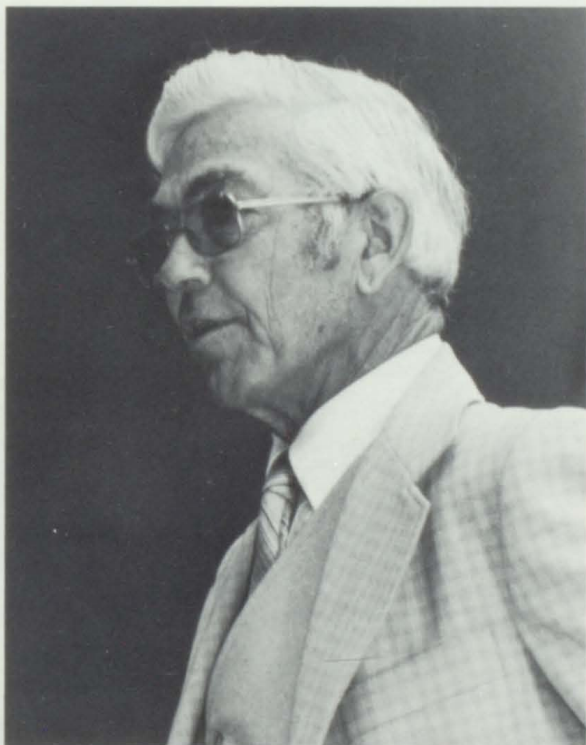


# Administration

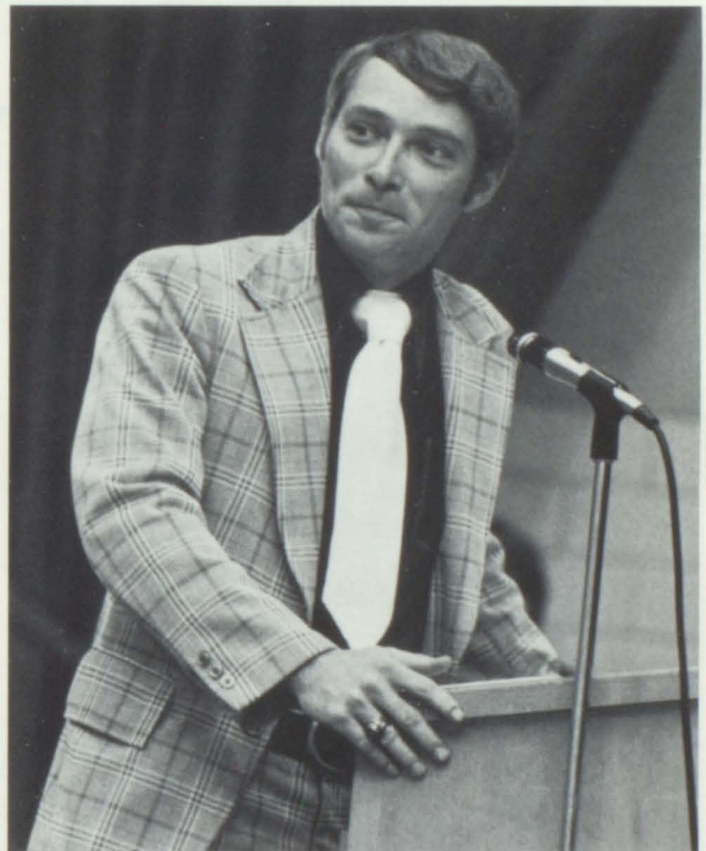

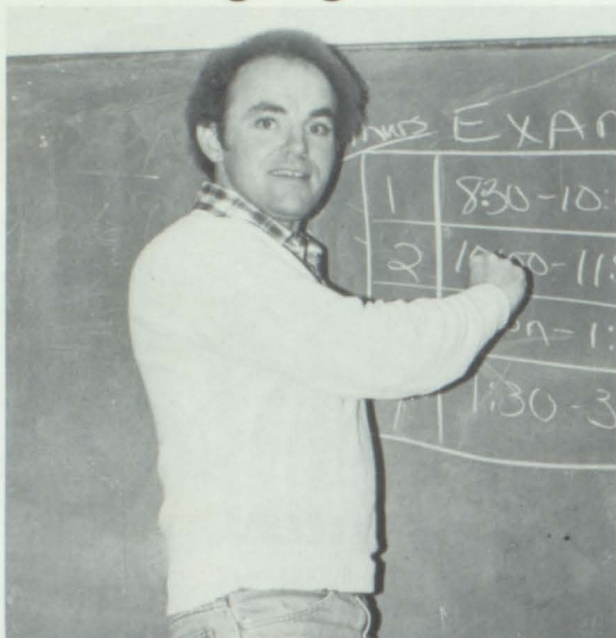

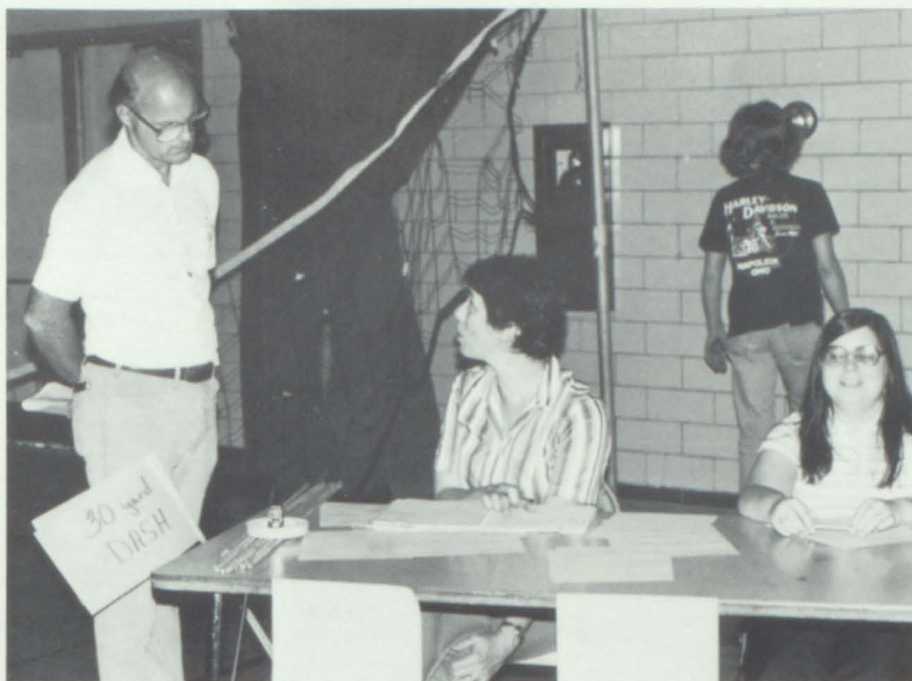

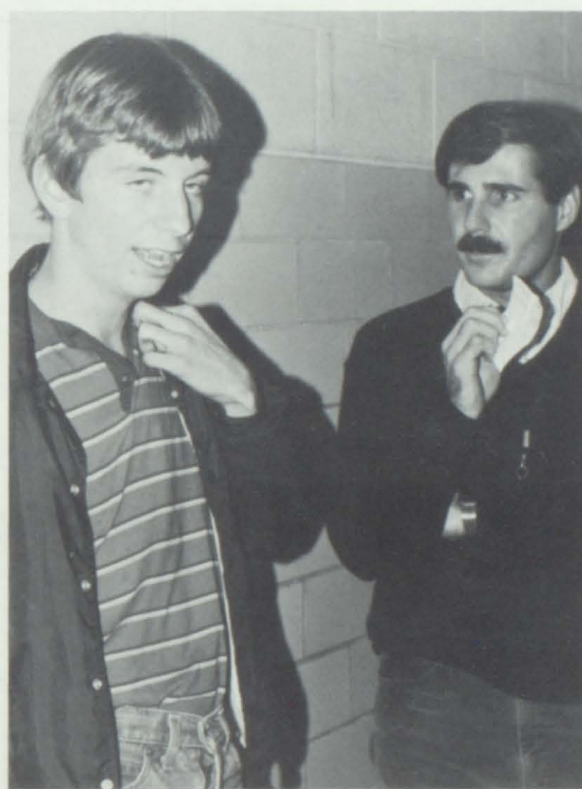
