



Math


The mathematics classes offer a variety of learning from simple addition to calculus.

Mr. Utz teaches the basic math students.





Top right. Ms. Reed helps Lee McCartney on a tricky geometry problem. **Above.** John Straley studies his advanced math diligently.

Social Studies




Mr. Don Lang teaches the American History and World History classes at NBHS. Mr. Johnston teaches the Civics and Government classes at NBHS.





Art




Vocational Ed. and Shop




PENTA


