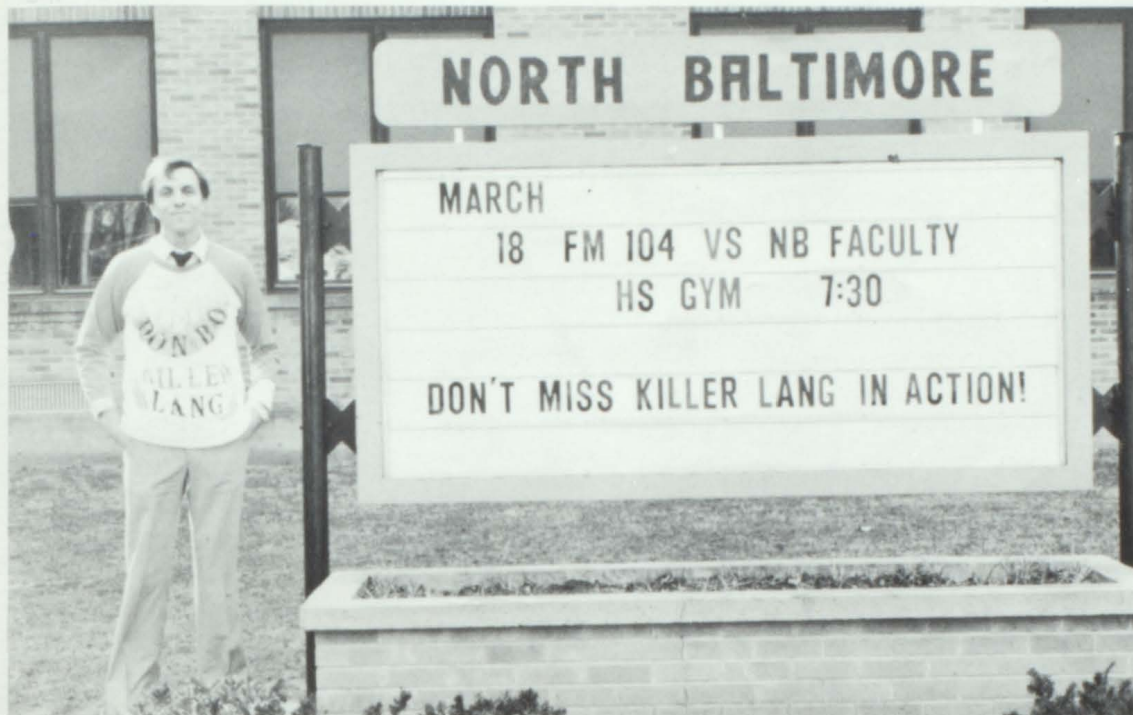
As you can see, the NBHS faculty was not so innocent in their youth. Why, some might even say they were hellions!!

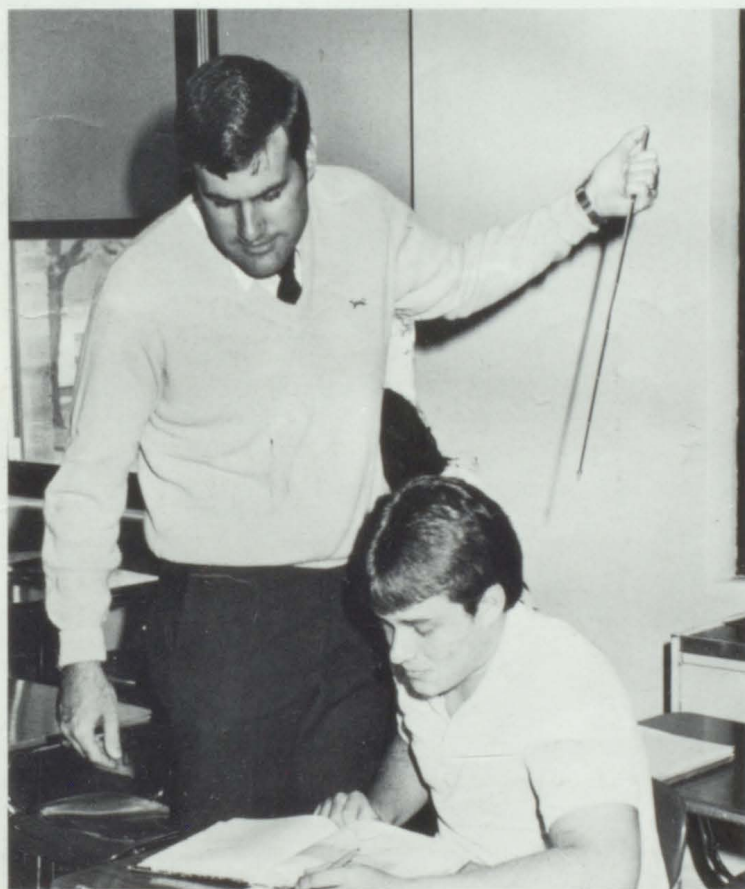

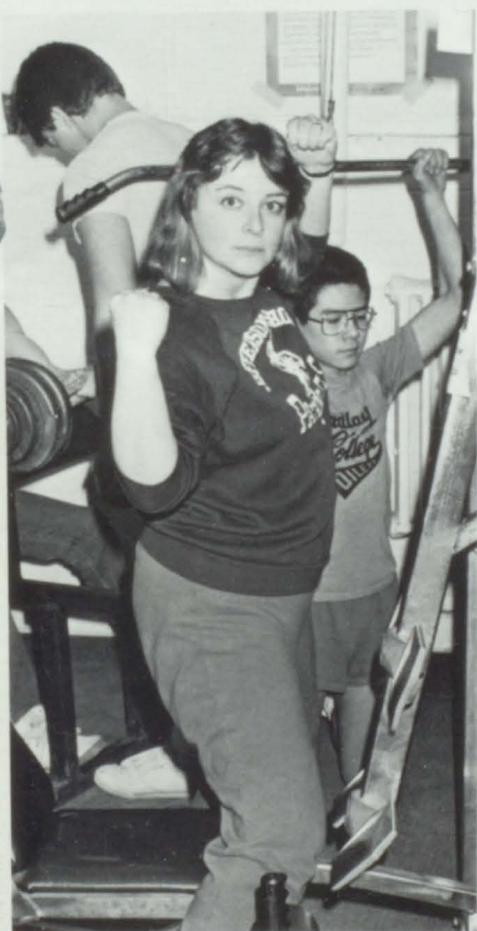

A big thank-you to these unsung heroes.

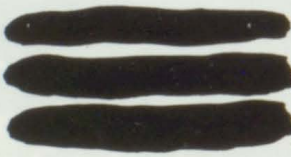

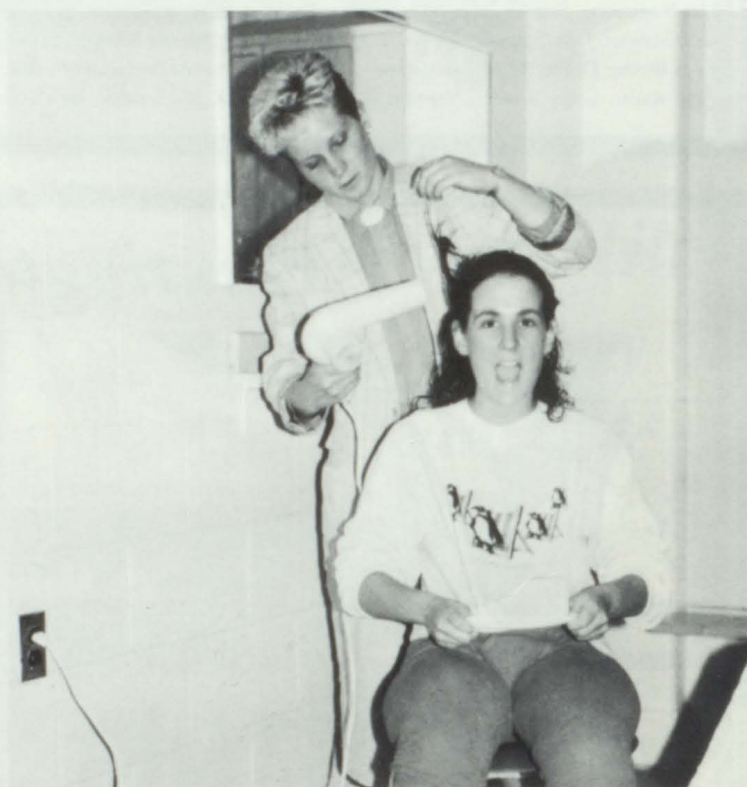
