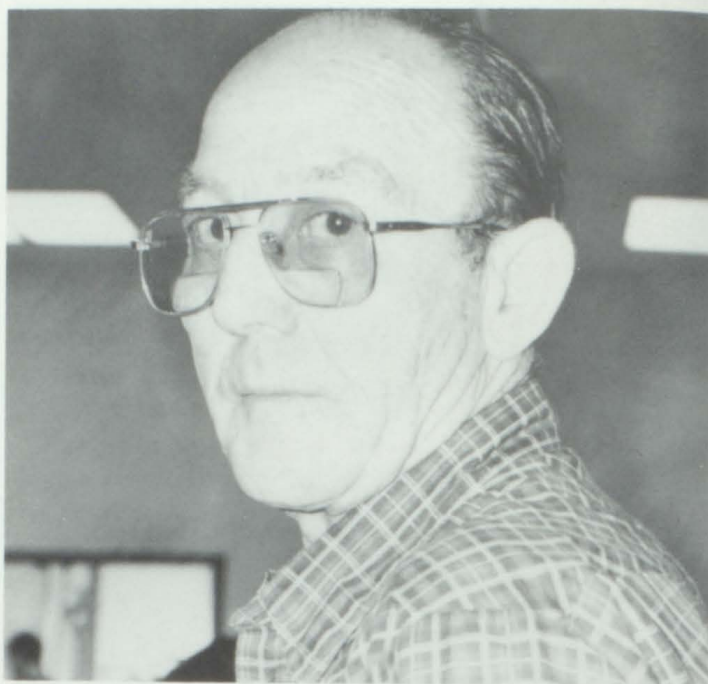

Scott Gillespie, instructor of O.W.A. at NB for seven years, said, "I feel the happiest when students change their attitude for the better about school."

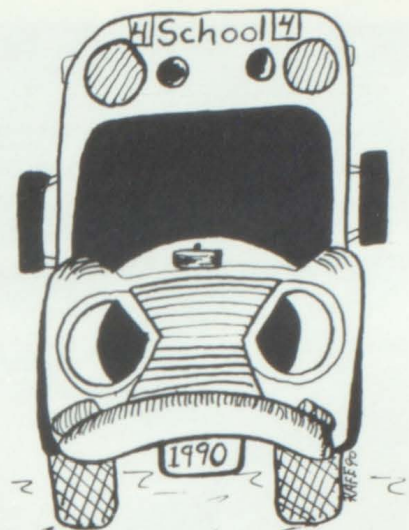

Now available: Bus driving job. Qualifications—nerves of steel, sanity to the fullest, and name of next of kin.

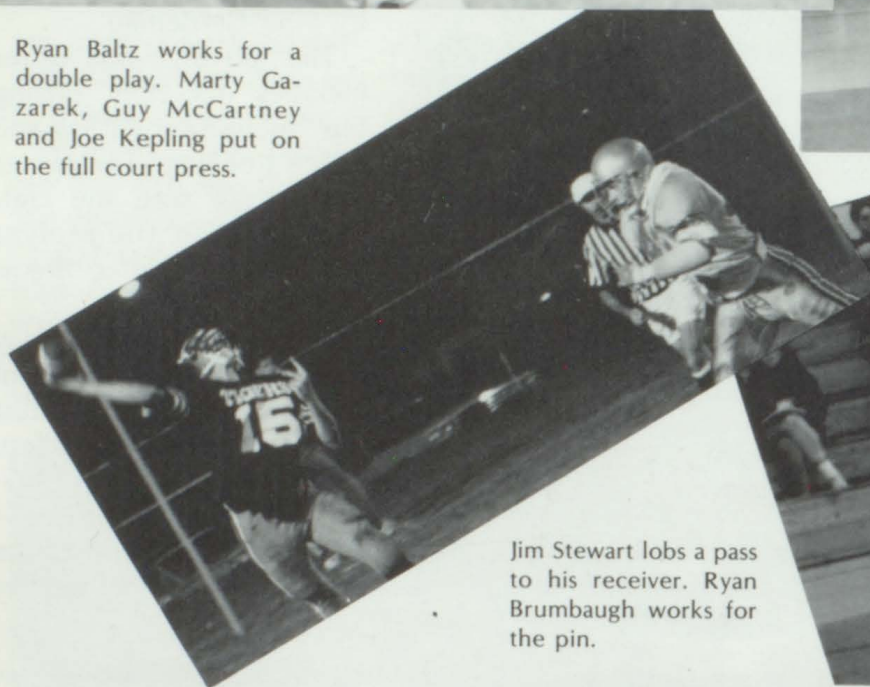

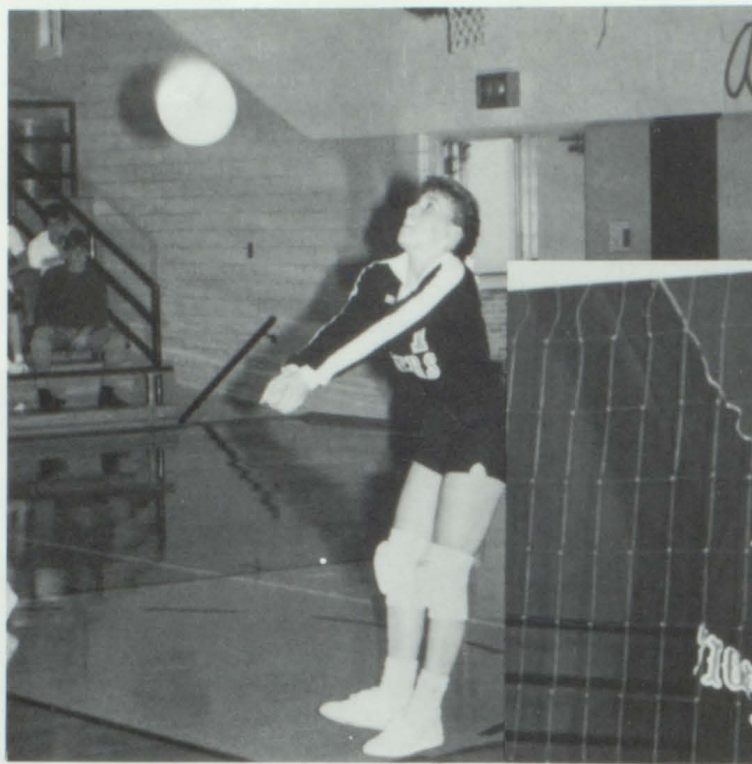

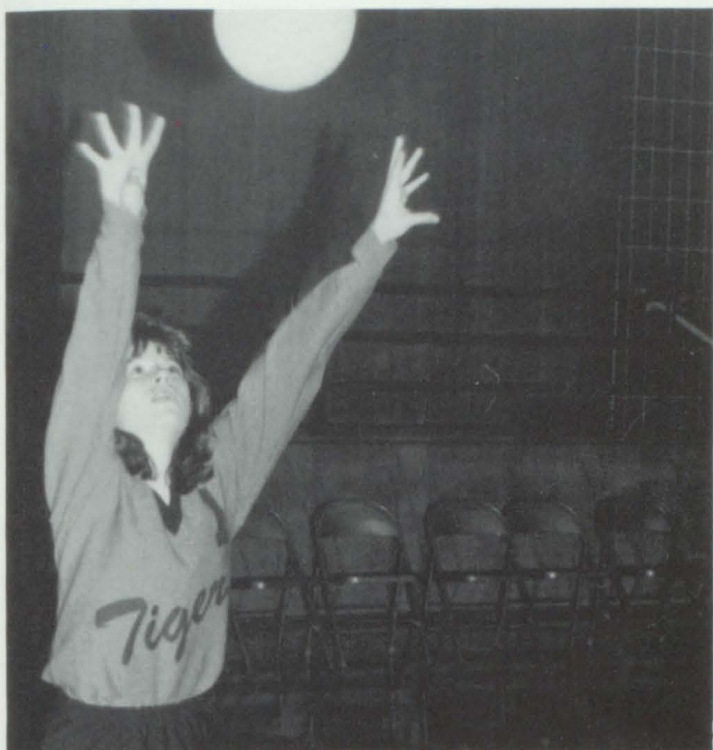

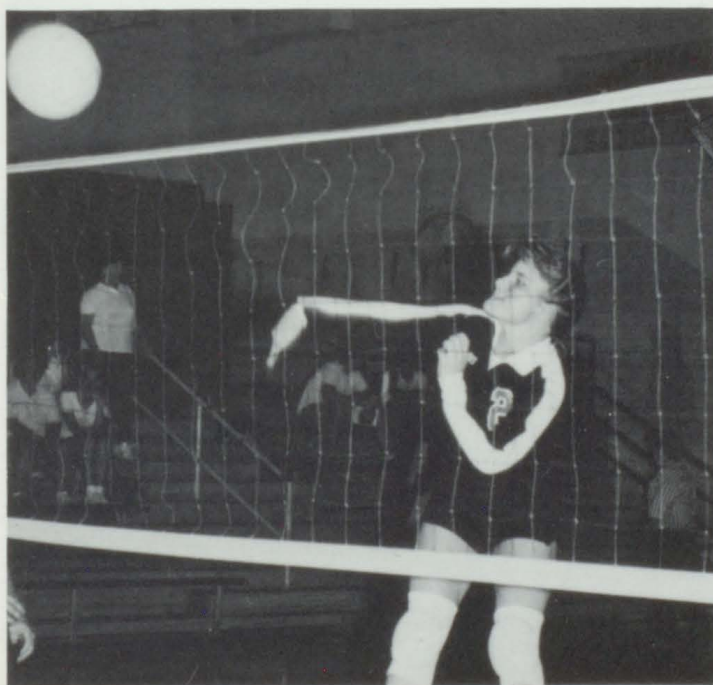

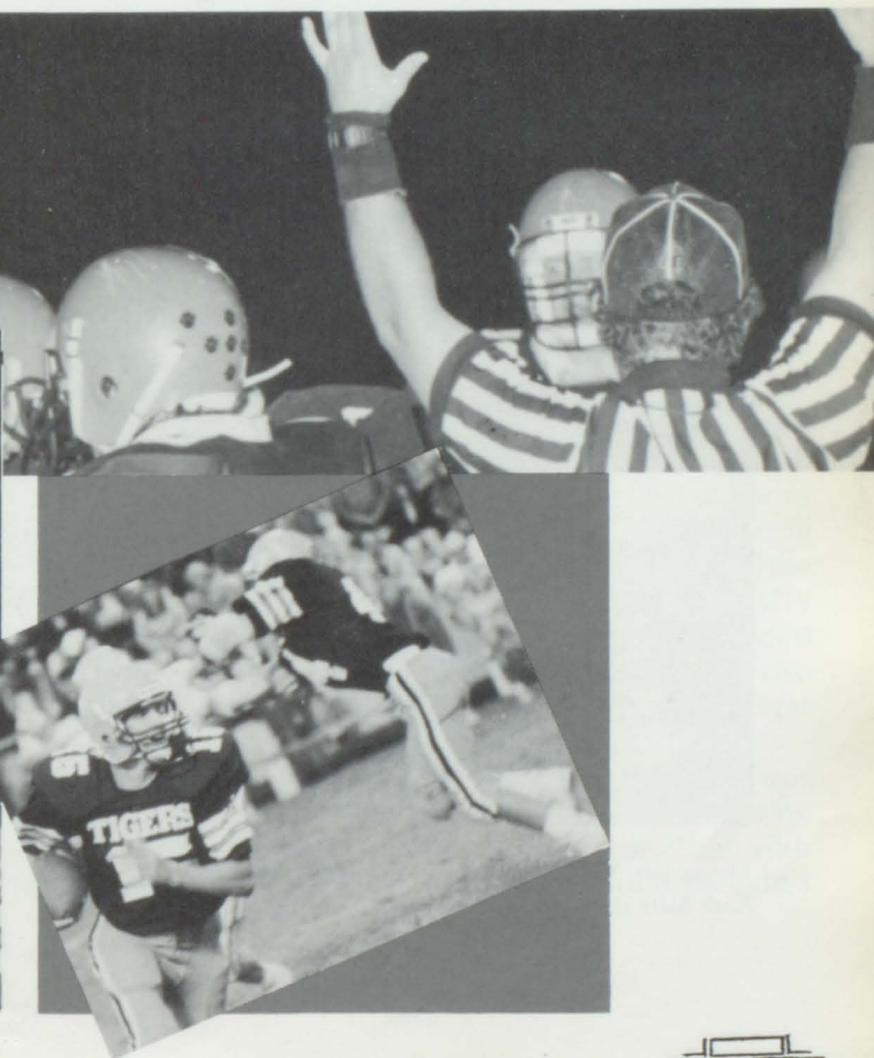

Chris Boggs collected 2nd team

Reporter:

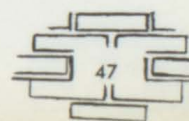
"Coach Dennis! What a remarkable year! How do you feel about this season?"

Dennis indicated he was "mildly surprised" at receiving Coach of the Year, "but with the season we had, I thought I had a chance."



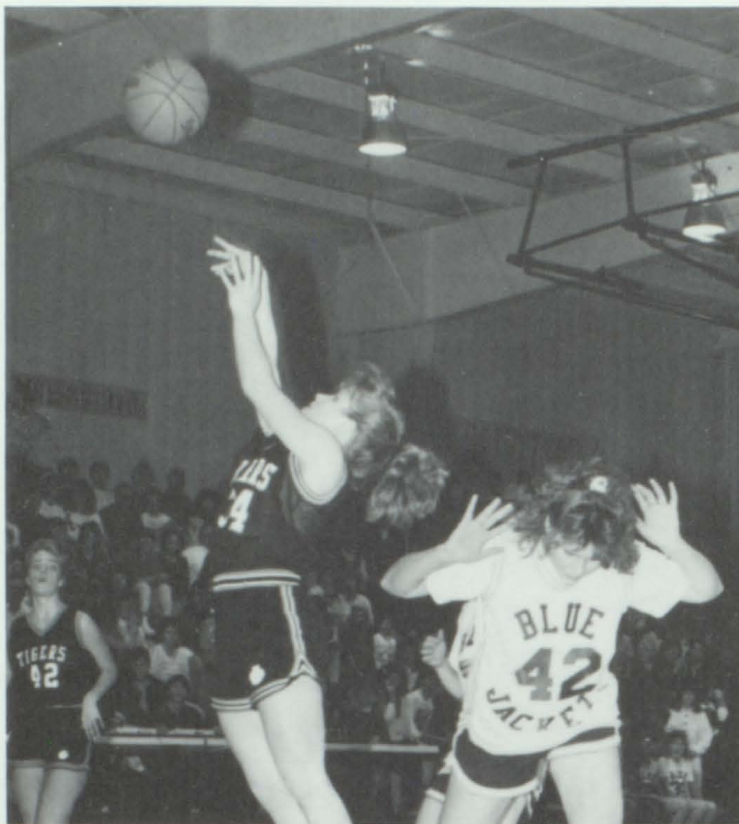

Senior wrestler Jim Stewart definitely made the most out of his first year wrestling by competing at the State tournament. Jim played basketball his first three years of high school.

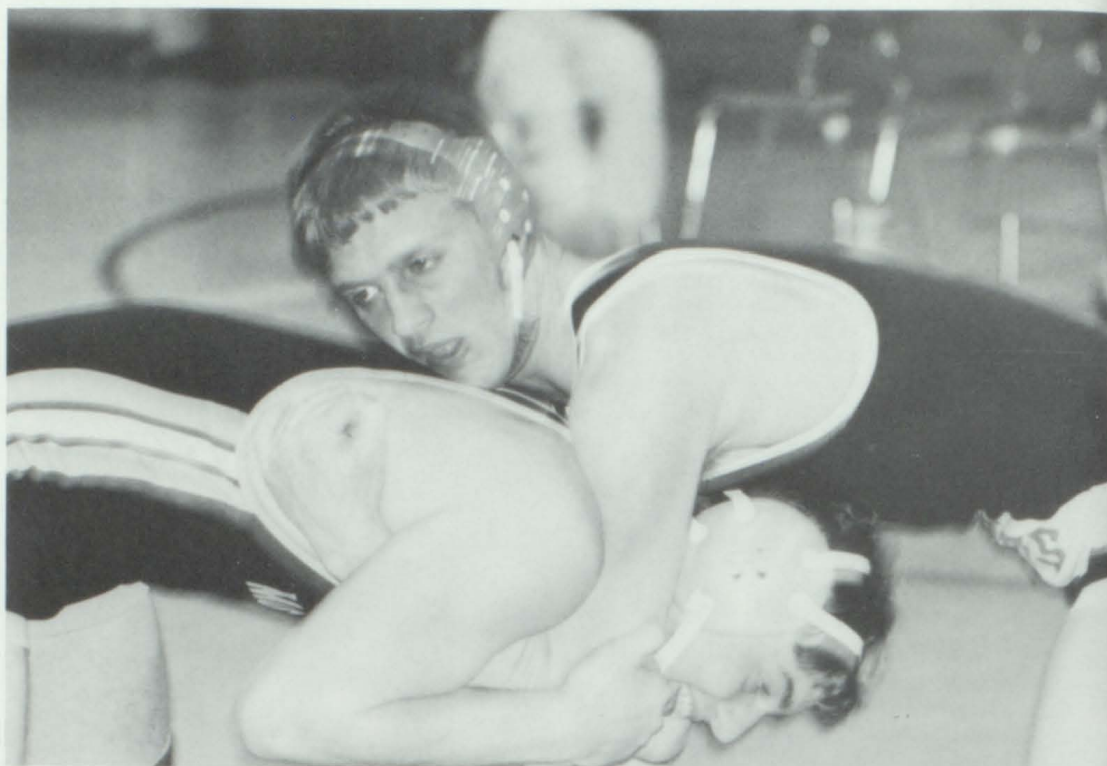
"I liked wrestling a lot better than basketball," he said. Jim finished the season with a record of 34-10 and led the team in pins.

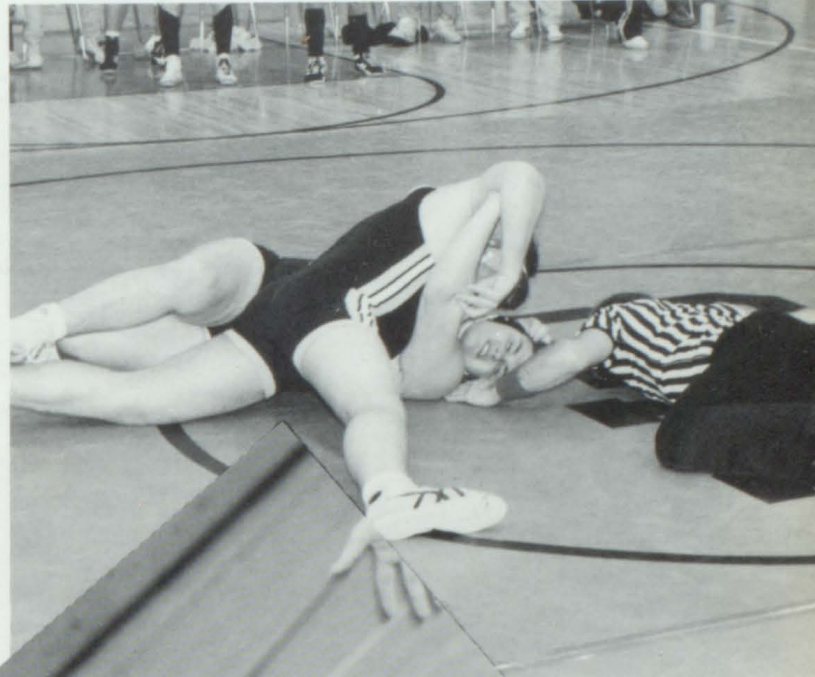
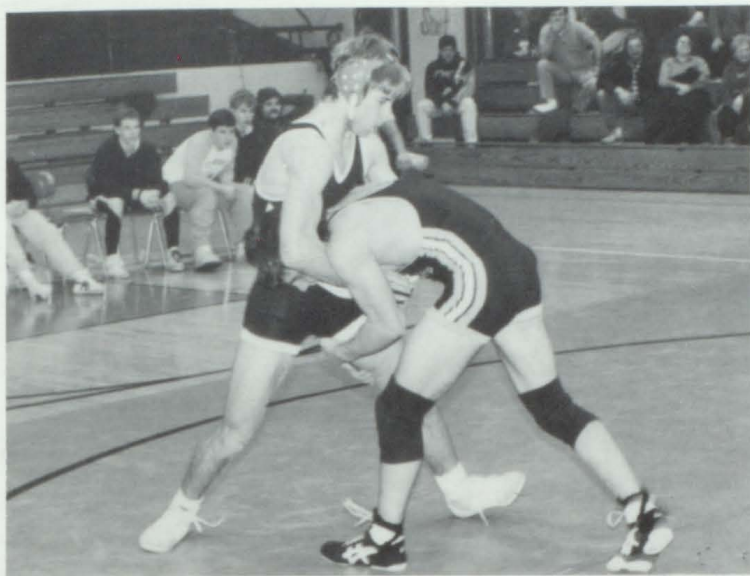

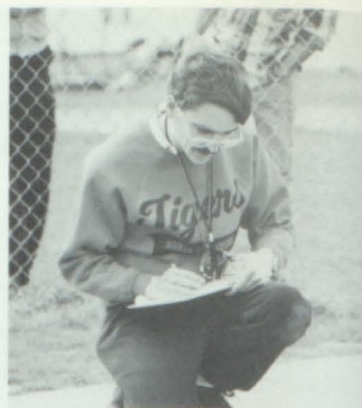
