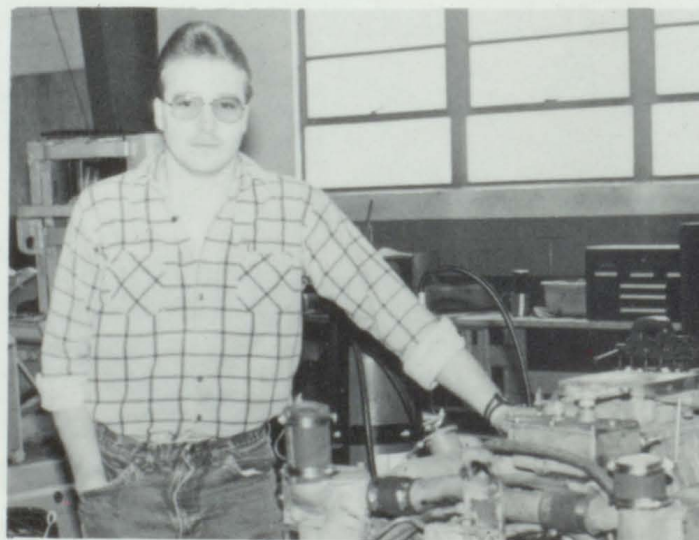

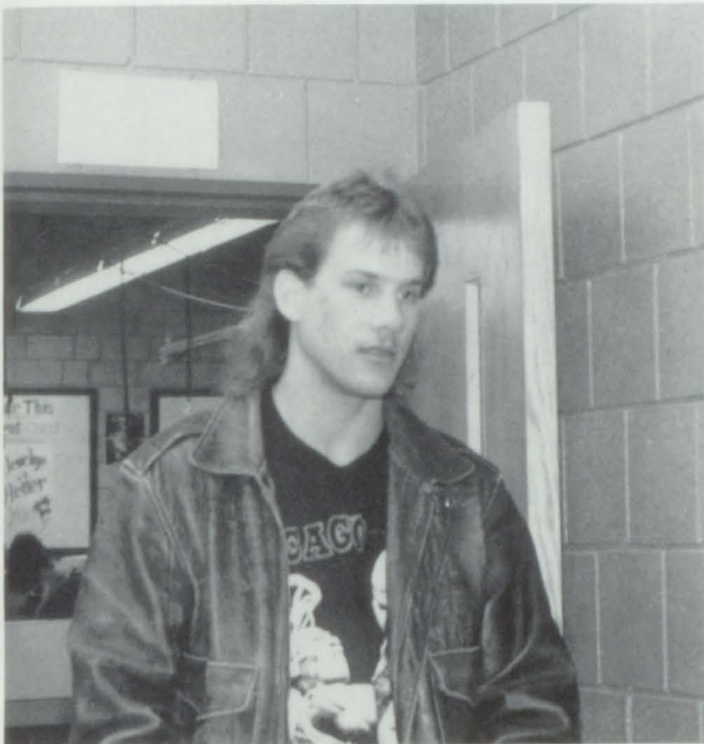

N.B. non-Penta seniors take American history their junior year and government their senior year.

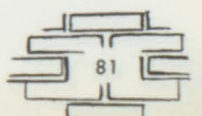
At noon Carla went out on job placement. She had to meet a few requirements such as maintaining good grades and attendance.

Honor guards from the Class of '91 included Greg Blausey, Eric Swope, and Brian Swartz.

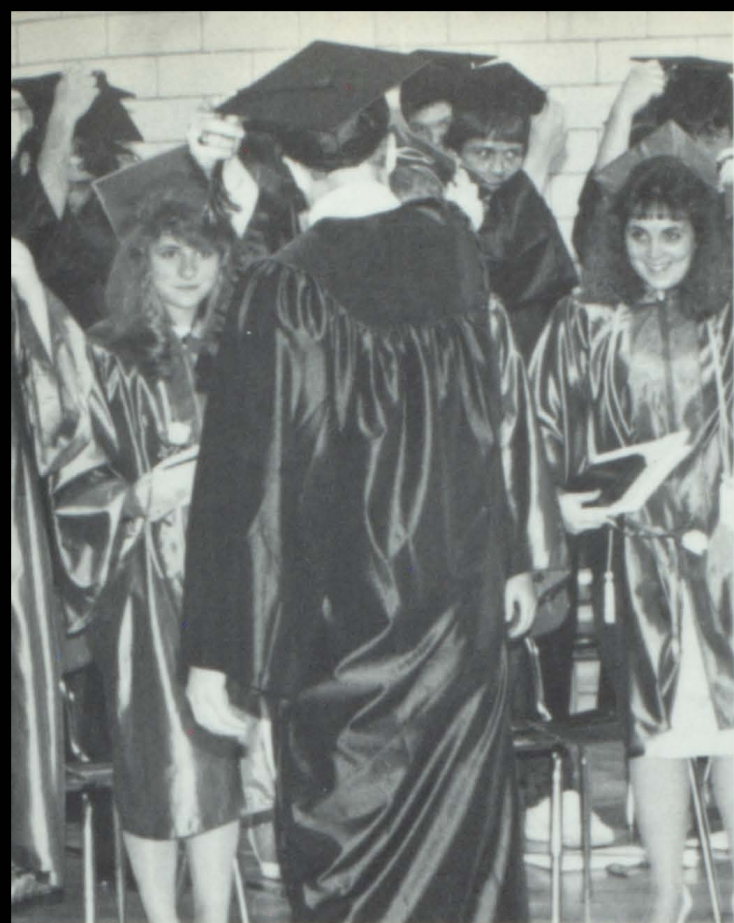
Usherettes were Heidi Ferguson, Brandy Mills, Deona Hummel, Alison Stemen, and Jennifer Straley.

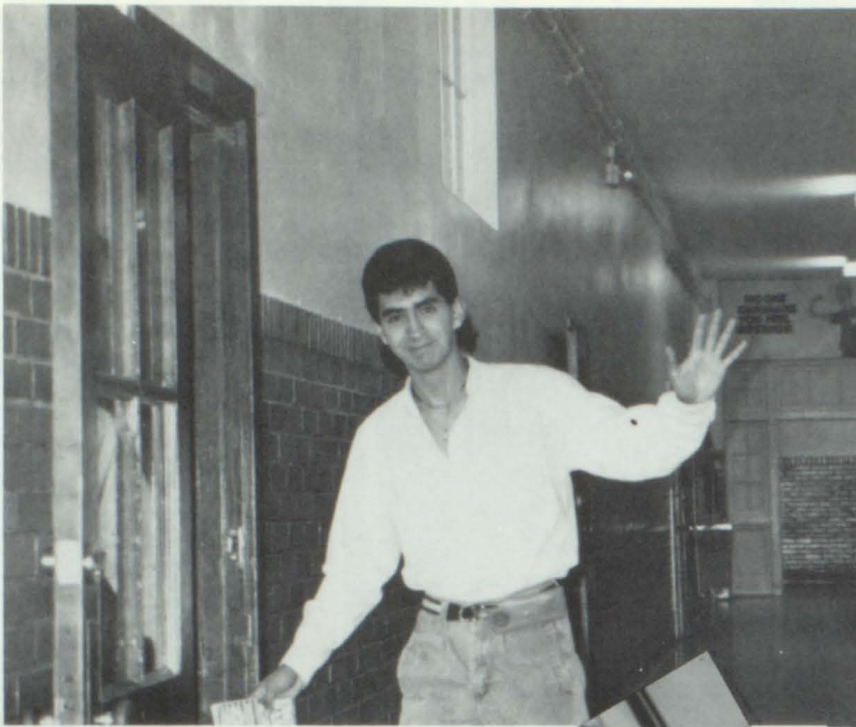

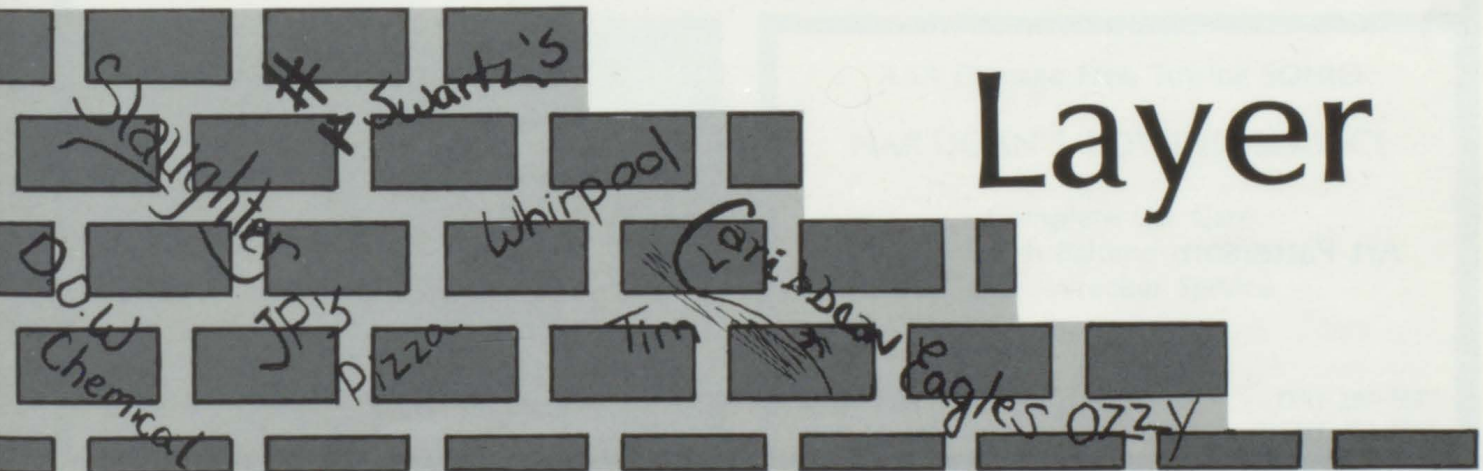
