In celebration of our 100th graduating class, the Tiger staff has composed a list of historical facts about North Baltimore.

Bassett L. Peters was the founder of North Baltimore.

The first school building was built in 1860 at a cost of \$550.

North Baltimore was originally named New Baltimore.

The petition for incorporation of North Baltimore was granted on Feb. 7, 1876.

The first oil well was struck in 1886 on a lot on Second Street.

Major fires destroyed many of the town's businesses and homes in 1885, 1888, 1891, and 1906.

The Post Office opened in 1874.

The first Opera House was built by Dr. A.G. Henry in 1888 and was destroyed by fire in 1894. It was rebuilt in 1895 and is still standing today.

The first newspaper was established in March of 1875.

A volunteer fire department was organized in 1877.

The North Baltimore Light and Power Company was built in 1890.

In 1890, the North Baltimore and Bowling Green railroad was built.

Dr. Eaton's Flour Mill is believed to be the first local industry built (1874).

In November of 1873 the first scheduled train entered North Baltimore.


The Senior Literary and Lyric Circle was founded in 1898 for the edification of women in the community.


The People's Bank was the first bank in town (1888).


