



Kathy Feehan—"I think a person should get it because of their personality. A nice person."


Shelly Simon—"I don't think it should be based on popularity. I think it should be how she acts year-round."







Rob Green—"Because all girls are nothing but trouble, and I don't want to waste my time and money."












