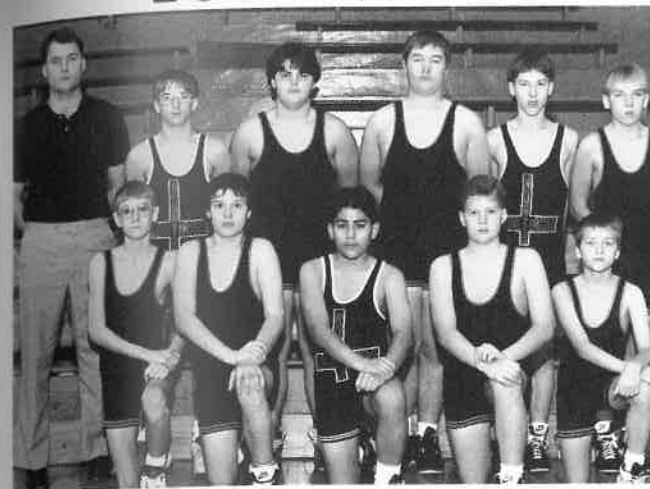

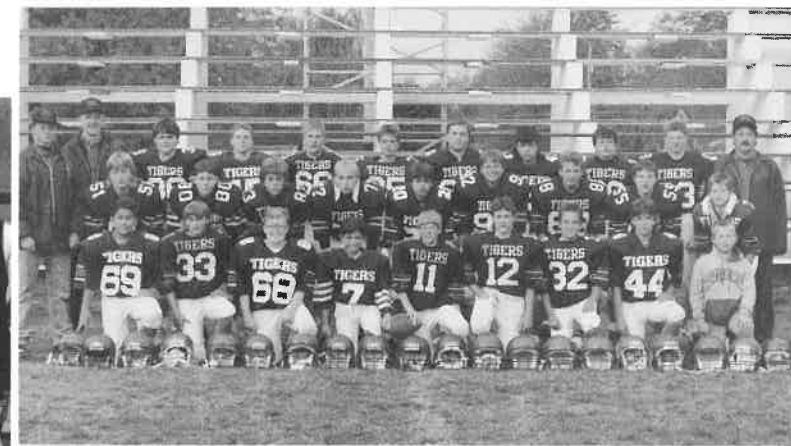

What did you think of the season?

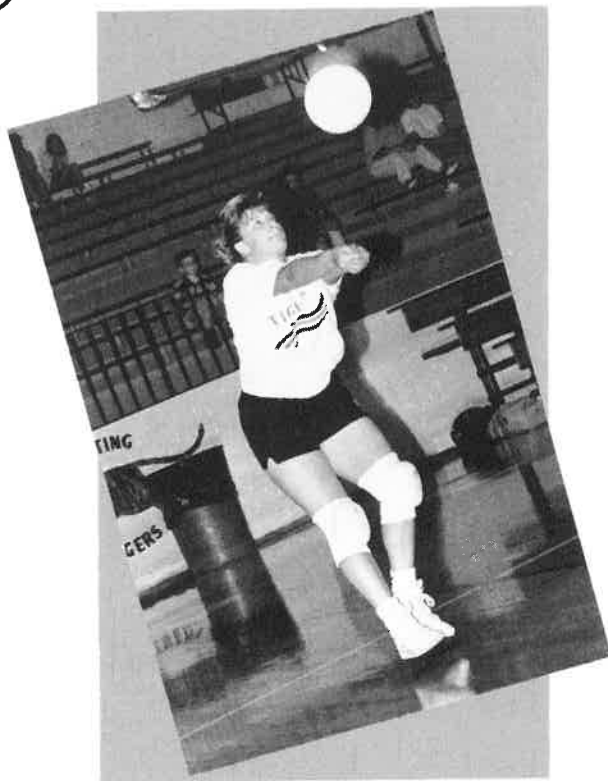
Ryan Bishop—"I thought they had a lot of talent, but it just wasn't put to good use."

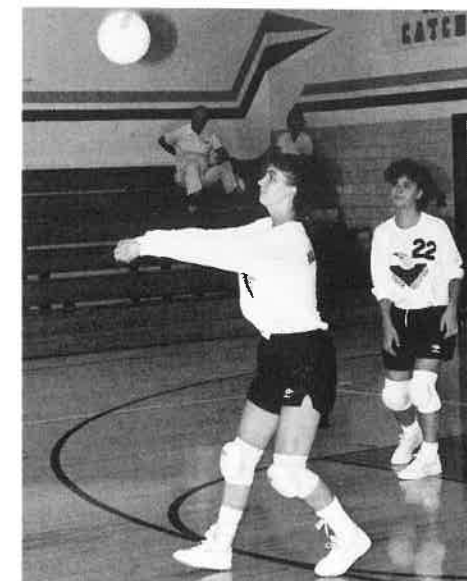

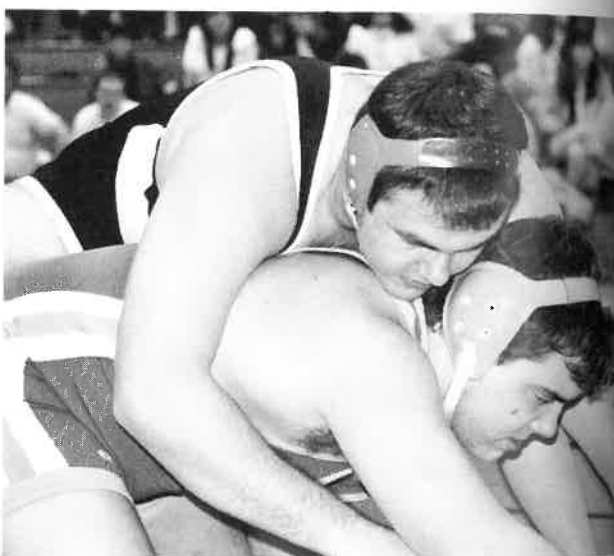

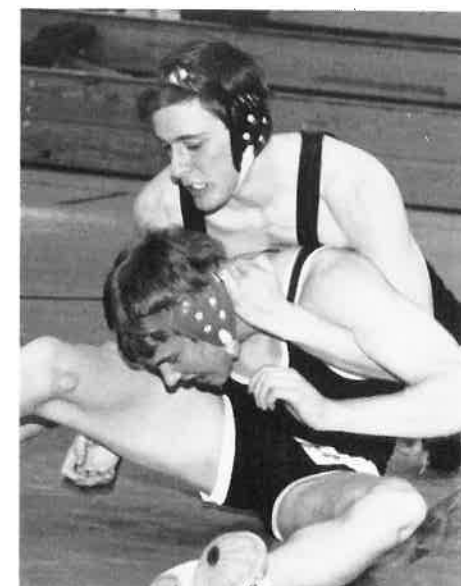

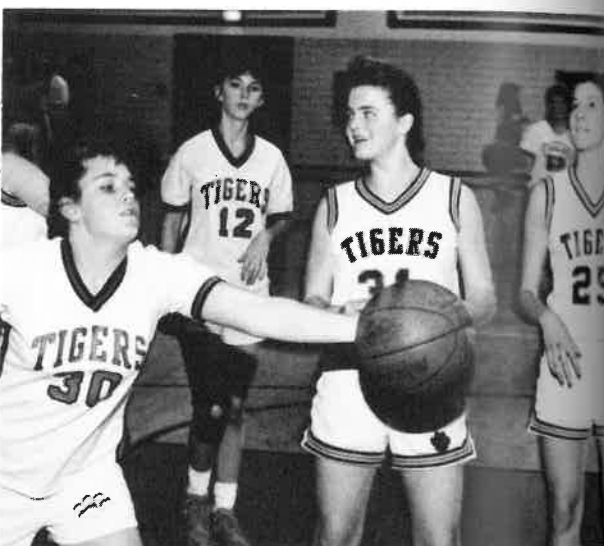

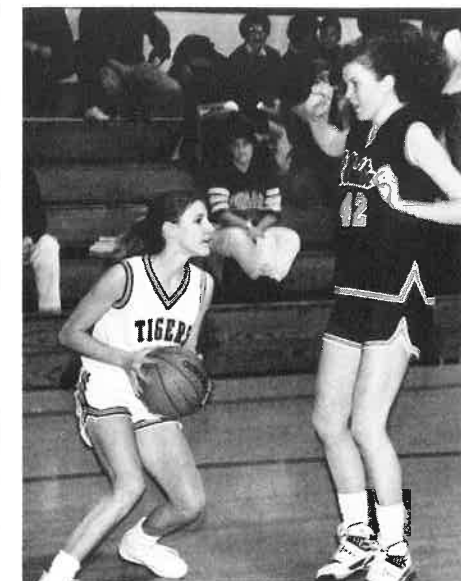

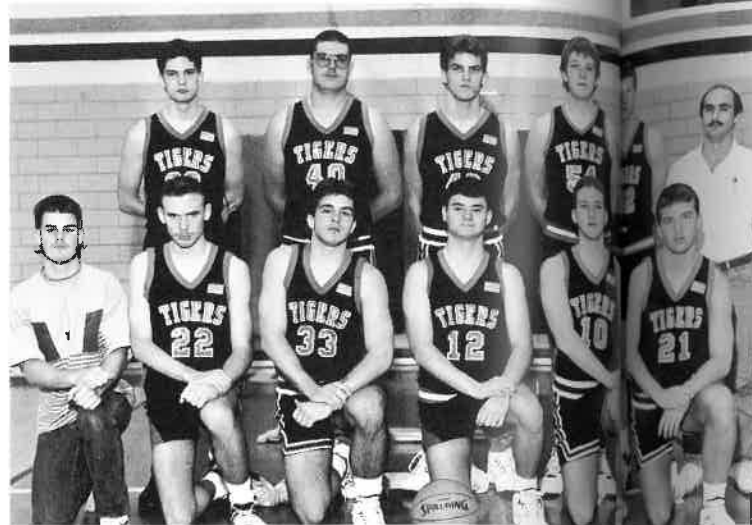

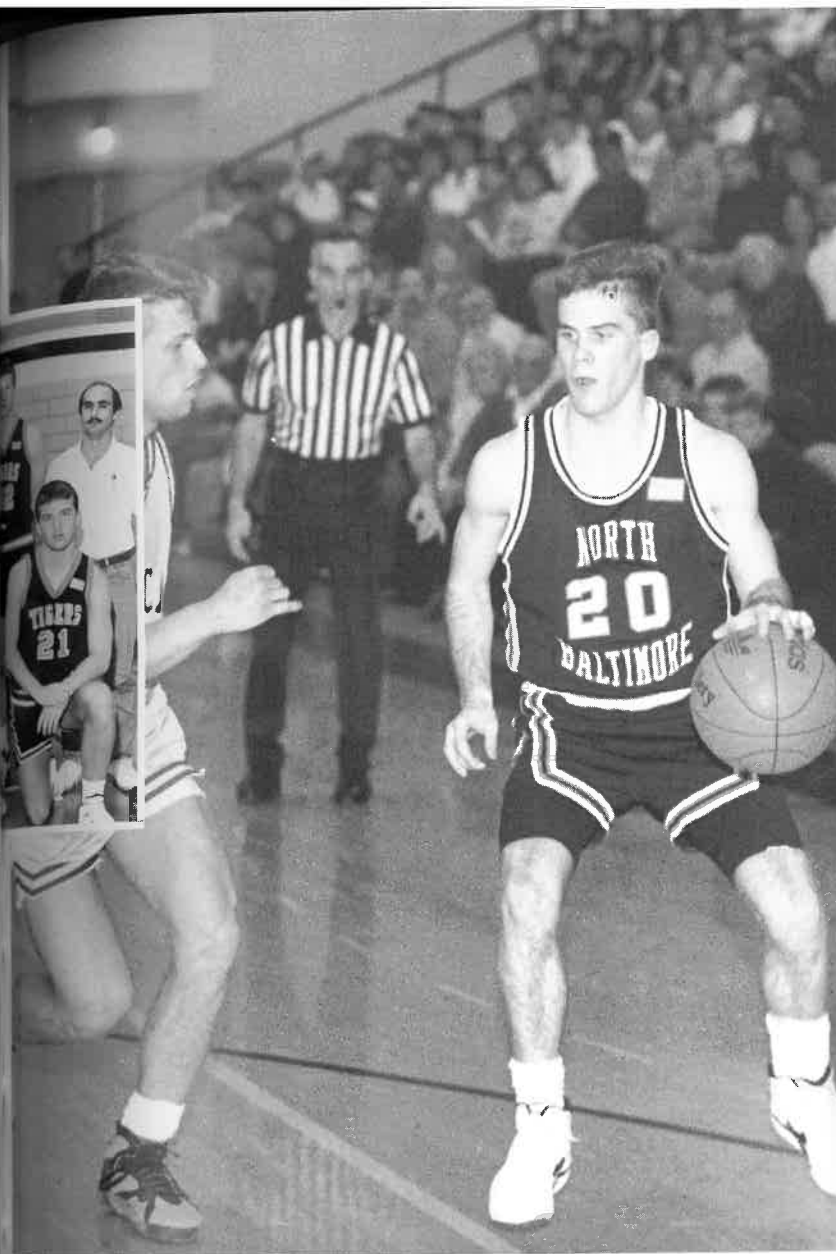

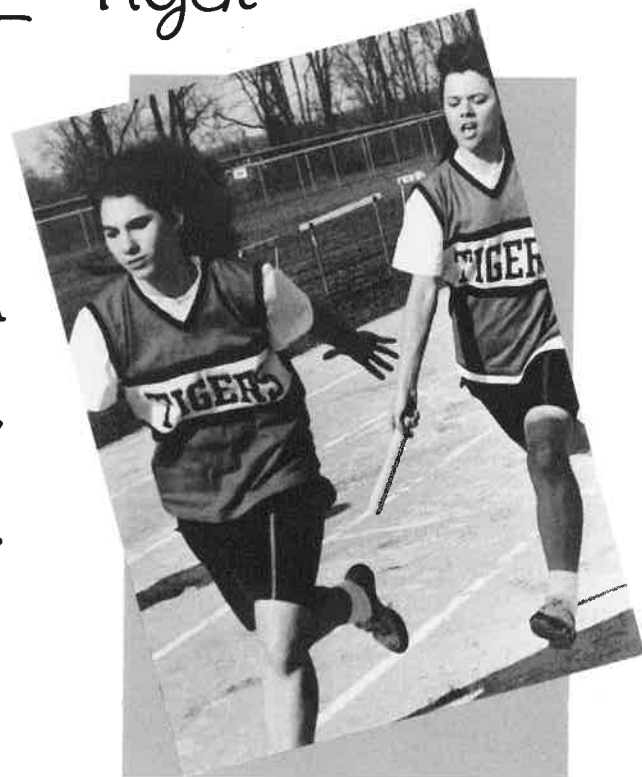

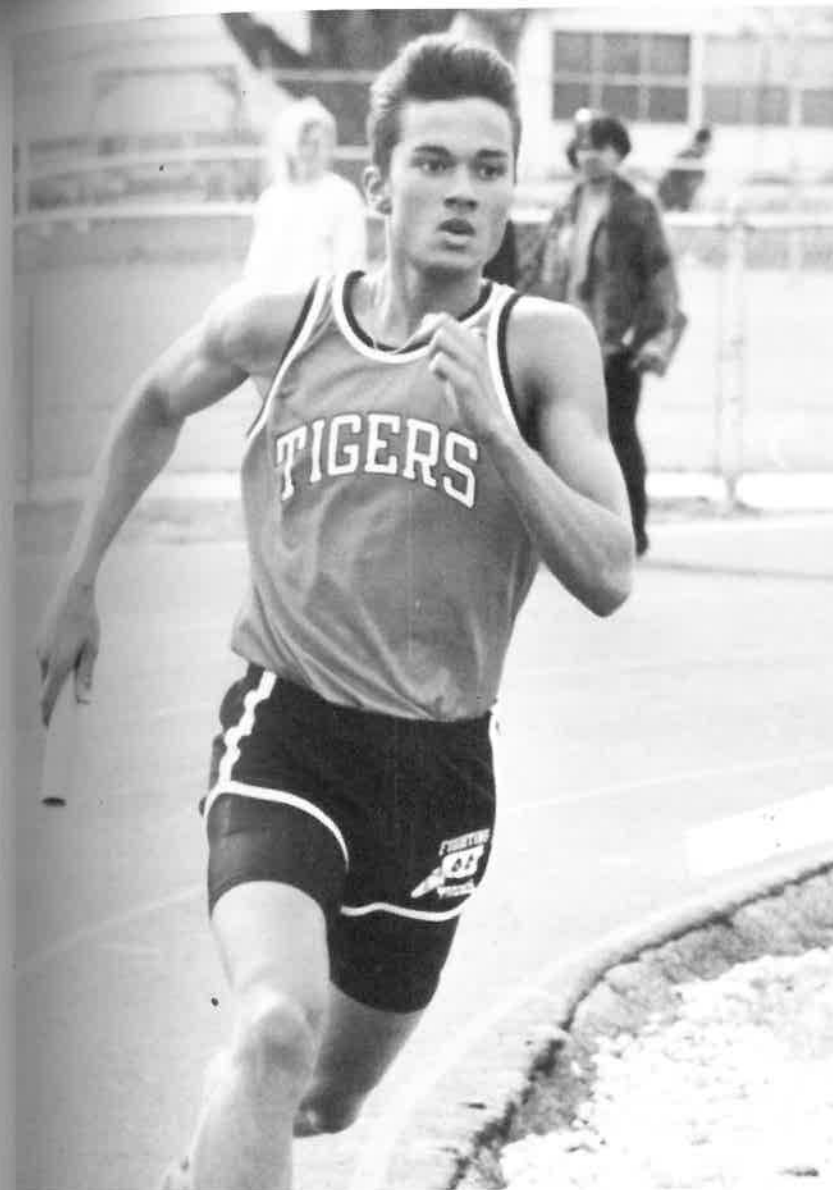

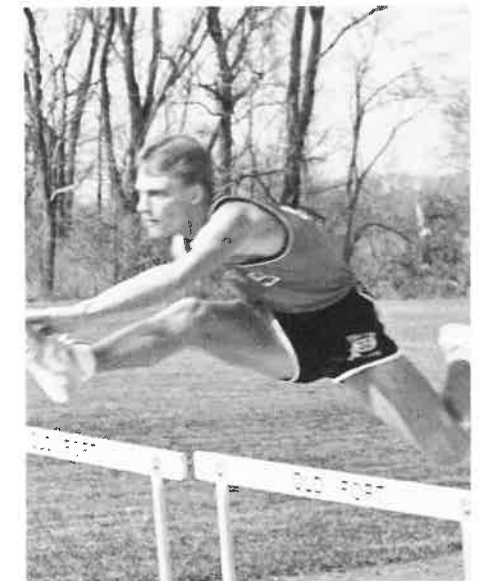

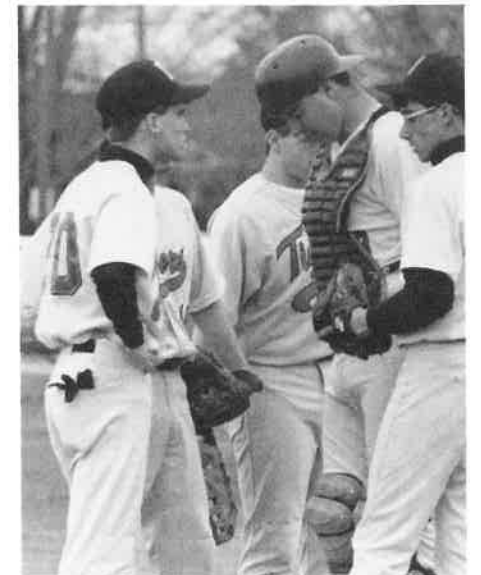
