On November 21 eight students and two staff members departed NBHS to attend a leadership conference with students and faculty members from nine of the eleven schools in the MAL.

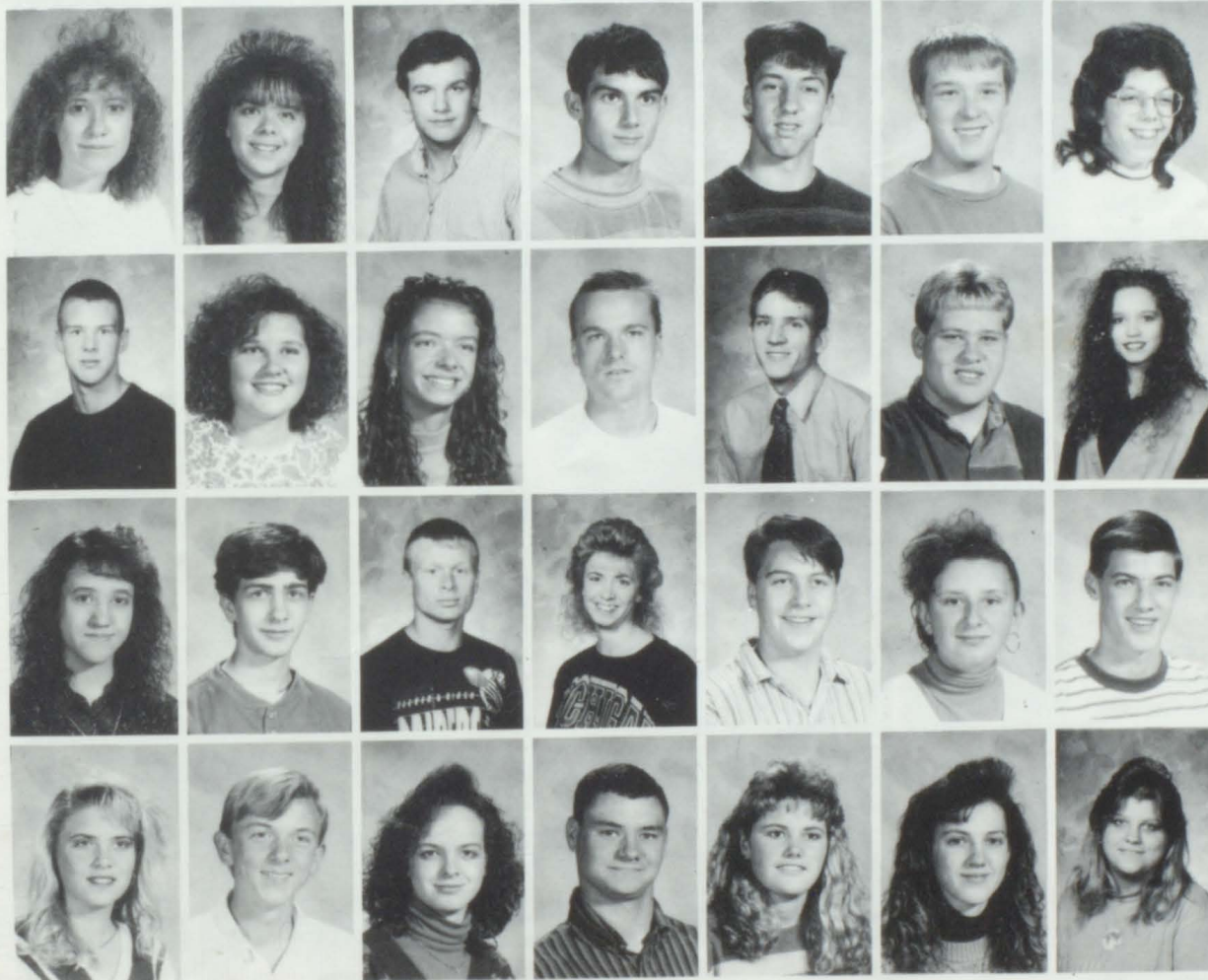

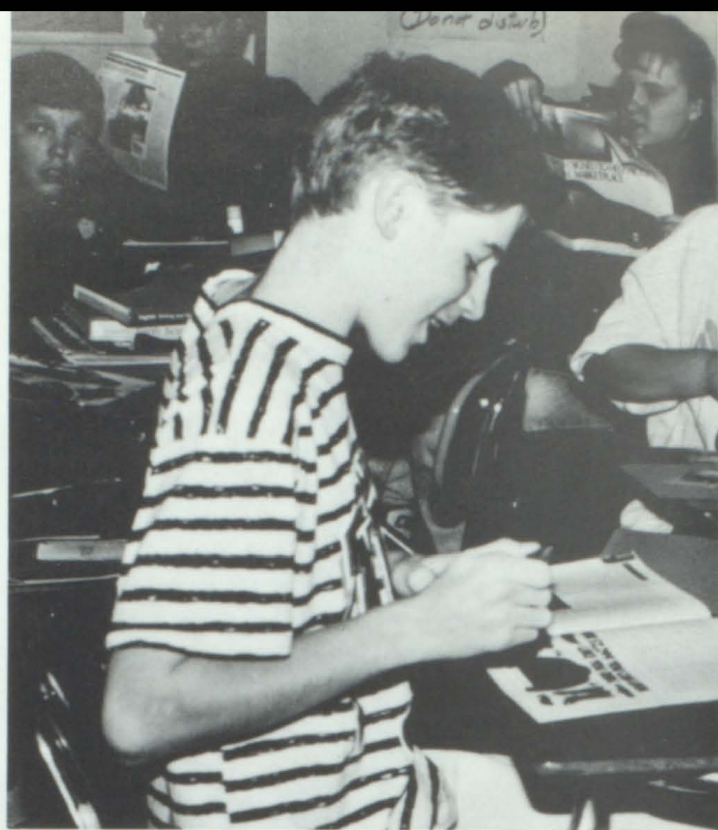
