





The 1992 volleyball season was the last coached by Glenn Christiansen, who has led the varsity team to a 59-36 record over the last four years. He leaves not a moment too late after coaching the fourth best season in NB volleyball history.

The team's final win happened at the Sectional Tournament where NB became Sectional Champs for the fourth consecutive year. Their wins over Arcadia and Van Buren put them up against Hardin Northern in the District Tourney where NB lost a close match. This ended Christiansen's four-year tenure with NB, which will keep Coach "C"'s spirit and drive active in their hearts, minds, and spikes!















