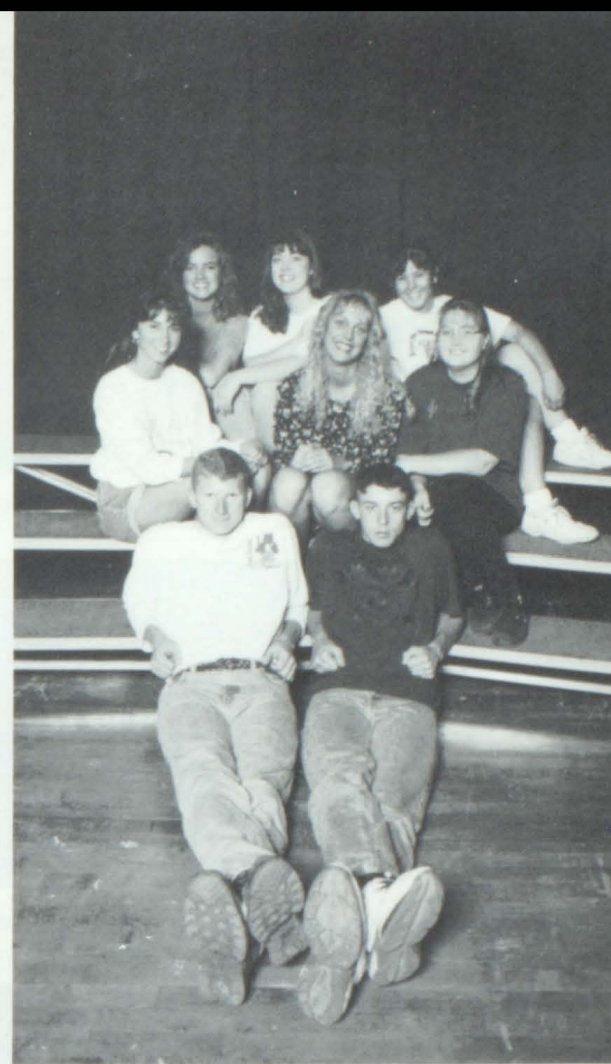

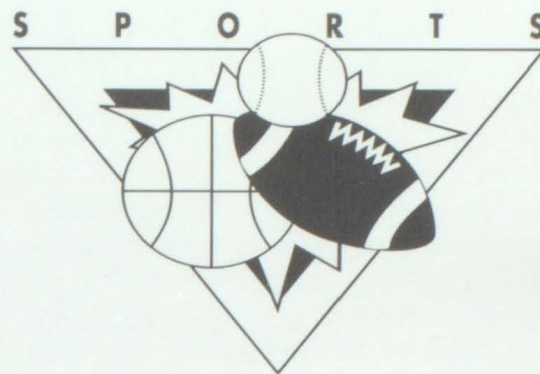

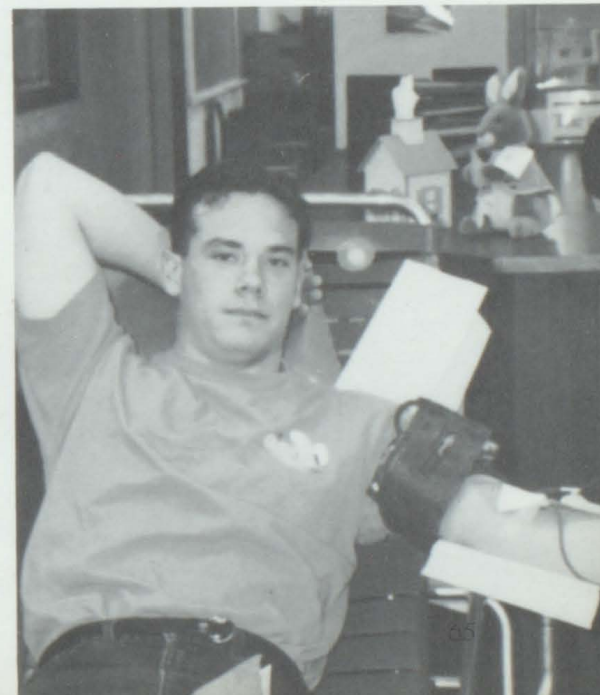

This was the first time in many years that the schools and community have performed together in a drama production. Anyone who had seen the show, knew it was a great success and are looking forward to next year's production.

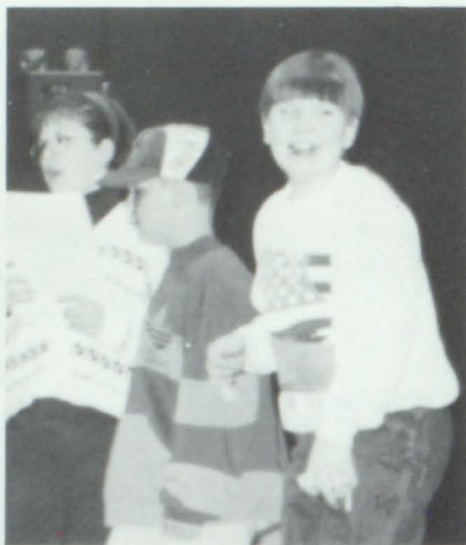

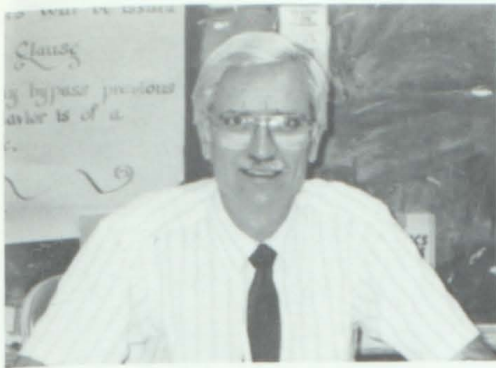

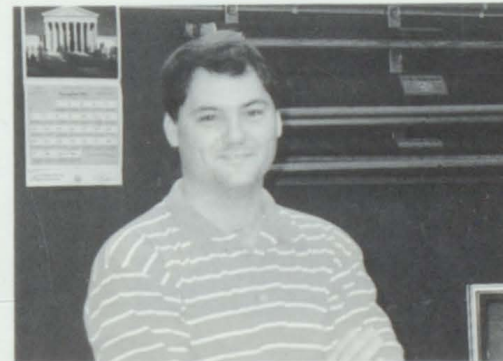

The secretaries have a lot of work in which they have to get done in a short period of time. This is why they have students, such as myself, working in the office to help them out a little bit.

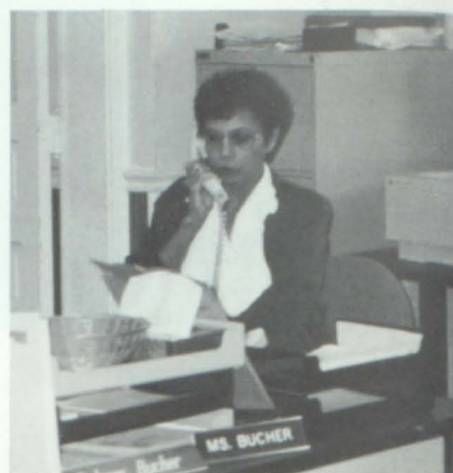
The office help gets students, runs messages, collects attendance, does student numbers, and also answers the phone when the secretaries are busy.

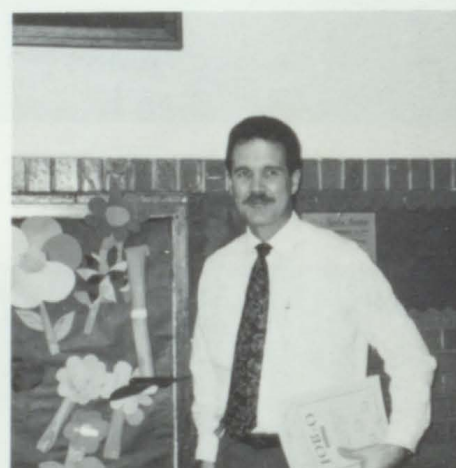
