




Getting started for a great 1995 season was no easy task. Weight lifting and training camp lasted several months. However, by the beginning of September it

had paid off. By the first game the Tigers had 35 stronger, faster players running onto the field than ever before.

The Tigers were ready Sept. 1, 1995 as the beginning of the season started. The show of a 23-6 win over McComb proved how ready the Tigers were. The Tiger offense and defense dominated by piling up 249 yards rushing and 54 yards passing, while the stingy defense allowed only 83 yards rushing and 4 yards passing.

Homecoming was a special night. They had their eyes set on a win over Tiffin Calvert, which would be the first win over them in years. The Tigers had a total of 254 yards, but Calvert had 203 total yards. Tigers held on to win, 28-14.

N.B. BLANKS CAREY!!! Tigers defeated Carey 10-0. That was the first time Carey had been blanked in six years. It was close the whole game. When the time ran out, the Tigers were on top.

Tiger vs. Streaks. On the first play of the game, things didn't look good for the Tigers as Kyle Kaden of St. Joe ripped off a 67 yard touchdown run. From then on out the Tigers controlled the close game ending in the nail biting score of 35-27. Tigers 7-0.

With a 35-6 victory over St. Wend the Tigers improved to 8-0, and took over sole possesion of the MAL and also tied the school record 8-0 season in 1954. The Tigers also solidified a bid for a first ever post-season playoff birth. Tigers vs. Hopewell-Loudon. The Tigers rolled to 9-0 on the season with a 27-7 romp over the Chieftains. At the beginning of the game they sputtered a little but

got under control. Their motor ran fine from then on out, to put on a nice show.

When the Tigers won against Mohawk, 26-12, to improve their record to 10-0, an impressive fireworks display was put on which everyone enjoyed. Emotions ran wild and the town did too.

On to the playoffs! On a rain drenched field, the Tigers battled Independence winning the first three quarters, but eventually and unfortunately losing the game in the fourth quarter, 27-17. The Tigers magical season came to an end.

The coaching staff the Tigers had given them the power and will to do what they did. It was all a team effort. What will be in store for them in 1996? No one knows.



















