SCIENCE FAIR

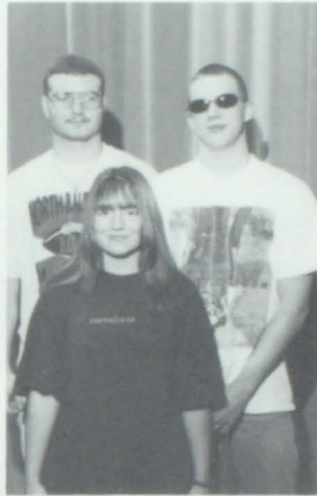
