











Six middle school cross country runners make their way to the finish line, running a mere two mile race. They ran through wood chips, mud puddles, over bails of hay and tree roots. Through it all, these six kids finished the season. Most of the cross country runners stated that it was incredible finishing a race with a personal record or achieving their goal. These students are strong-willed for participating in cross country, which involves both physical and mental abilities.

The Jr. High Coach Tim Troutner said, "The 2003 Cross Country season went by quickly." He also said, "The Junior High Cross Country course is 2 miles long, often winding through woods, around ponds, and over grassy fields. A race usually takes between 12 and 20 minutes to complete, and the runners work on improving their time with every race they compete in. The Tigers Jr. High Cross Country runners consistently improved their times achieving personal records for the season, and many setting new lifetime best." In his conclusion he stated that the tigers placed 3rd overall, "an outstanding performance" he complemented. He also said "next season looks to be equally promising, with several experienced runners returning, and the new ones joining the team."






