



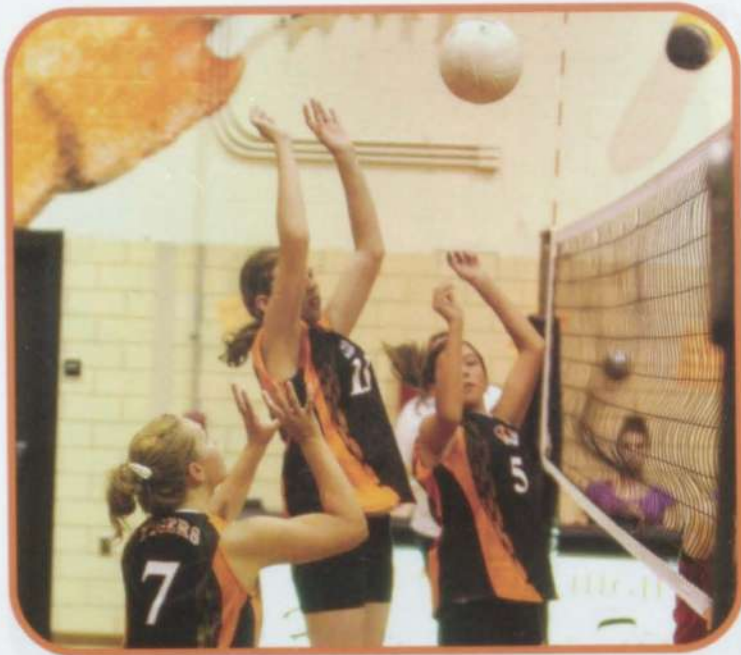

JH Football

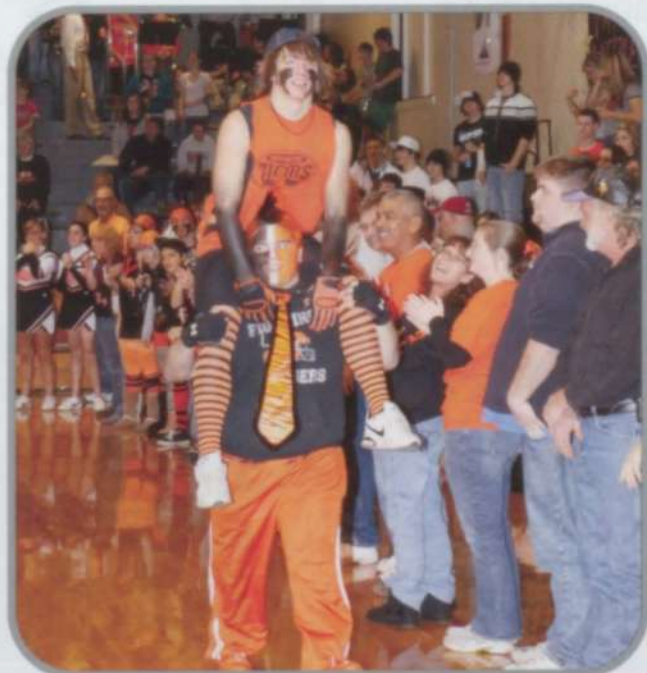

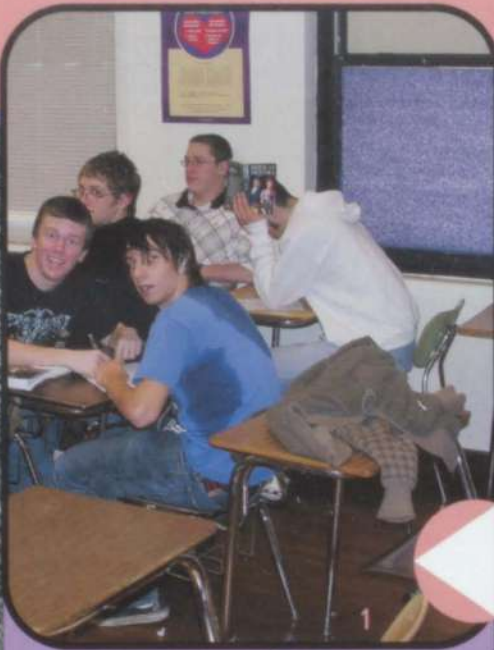
- 1 Dalton Ishmael listens to Ms. Crutcher go over notes. Dalton said, "The best thing about math is it's easy to remember, and it's not hard."

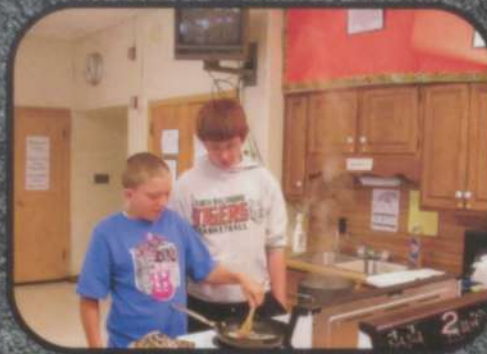
Retrace The Past

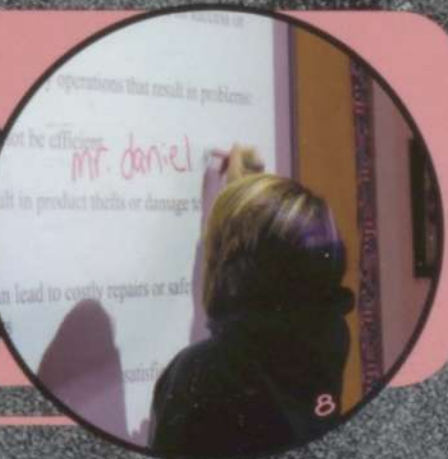
