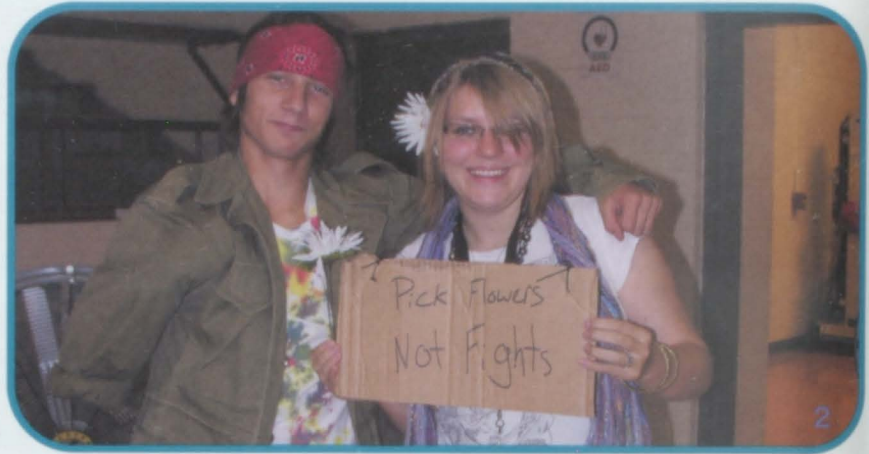
8. "The winter dinner theater was fun and different just because we didn't have just a normal play. It was cool that we switched it up and had a dinner theater," said Amber Archer.

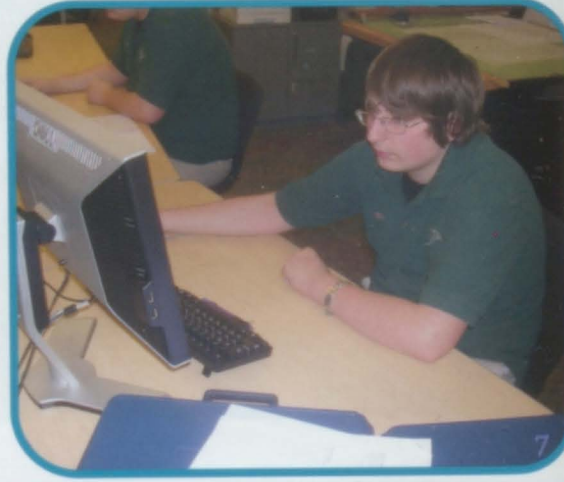

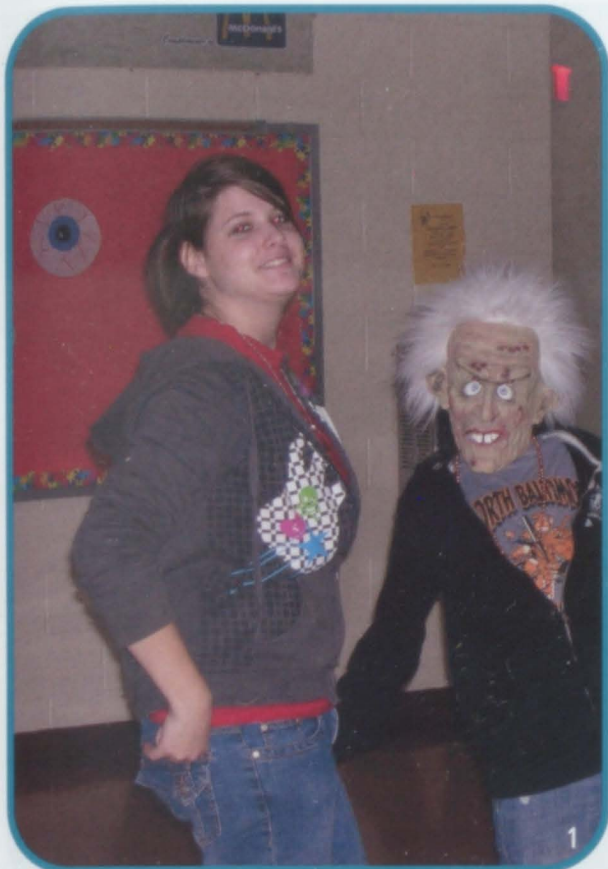


New School Process

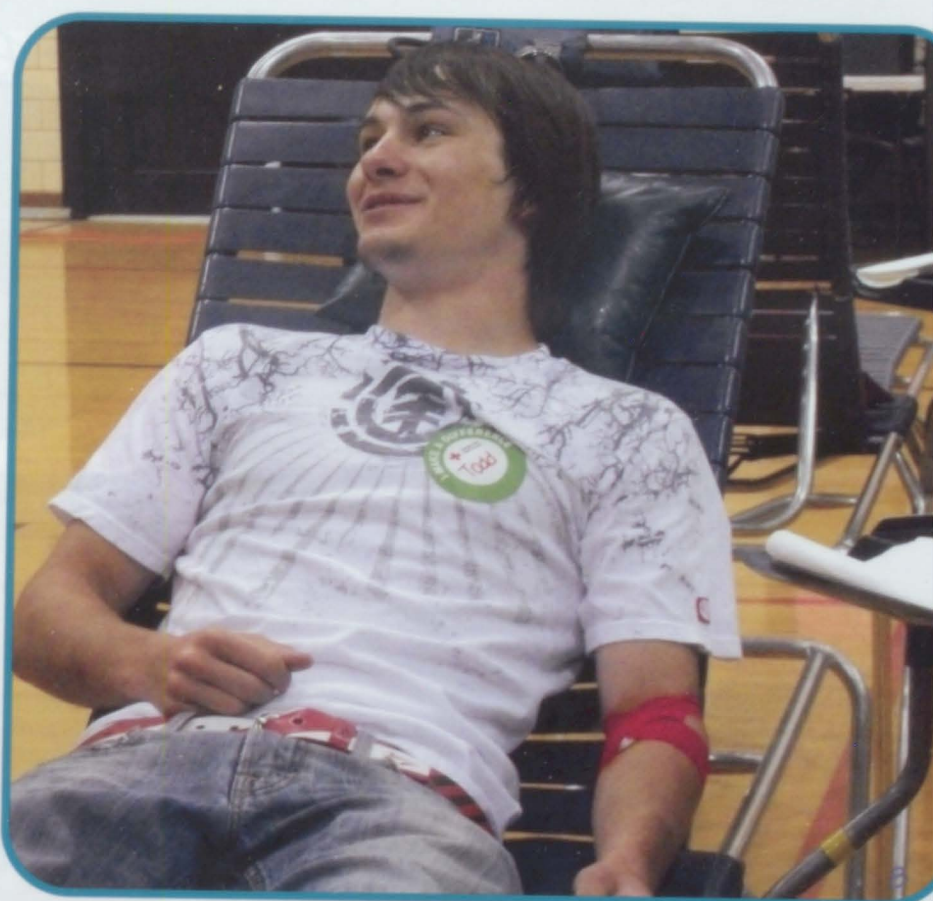
2. "My favorite event that I participated in was the fall homecoming parade because I got to ride in a
