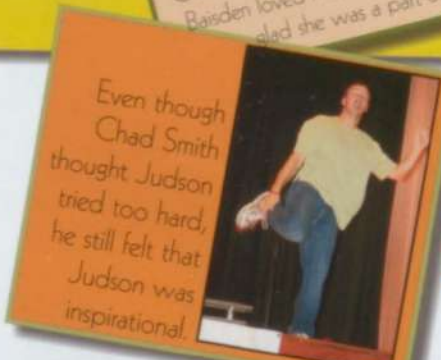

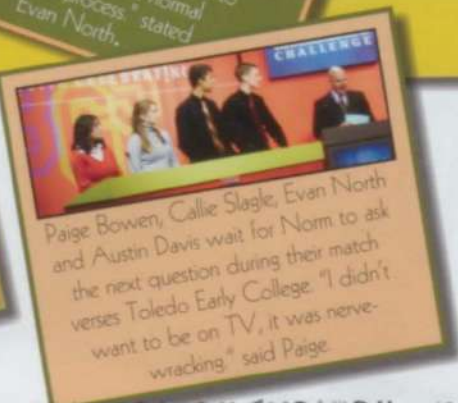
"My favorite part about quiz bowl is that it gives a chance to be exposed to questions outside the normal educational process," stated Evan North.

DISASTER STRIKES

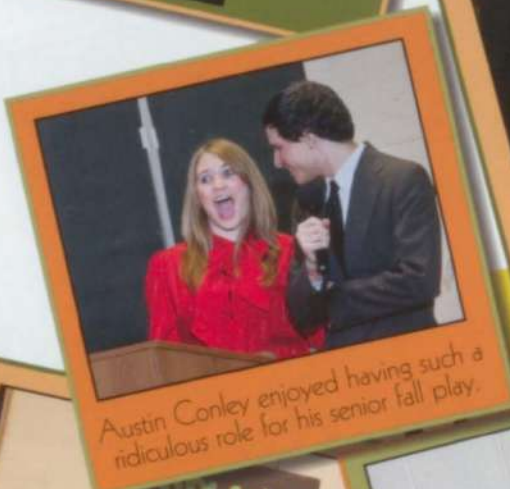

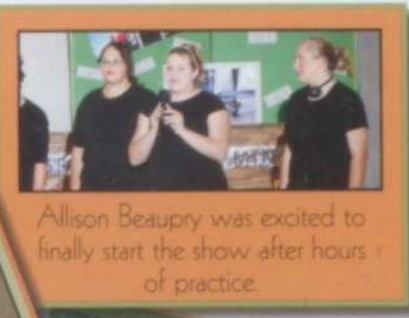

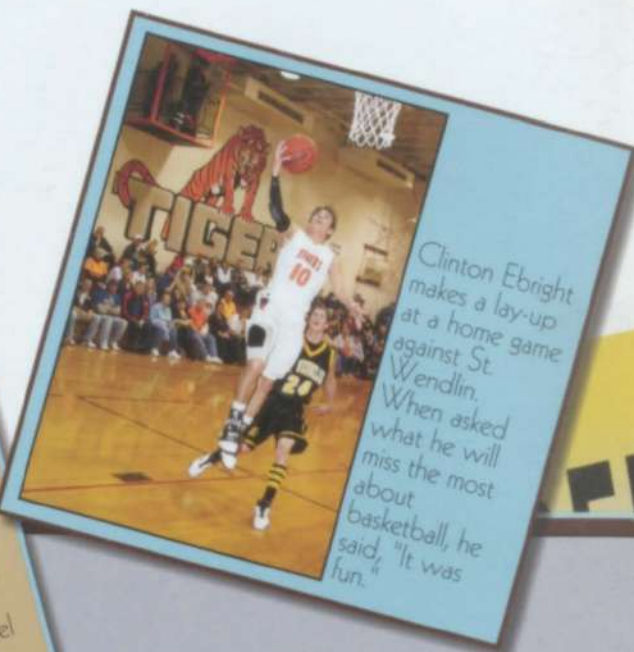

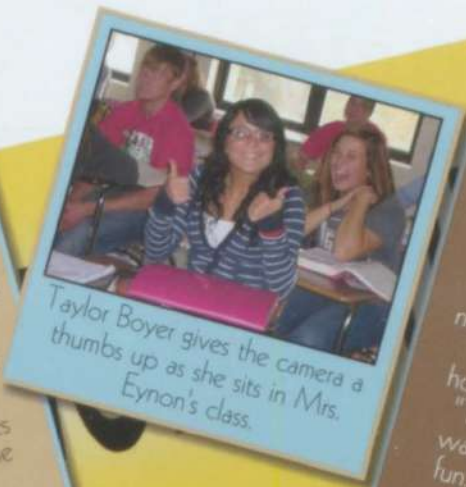

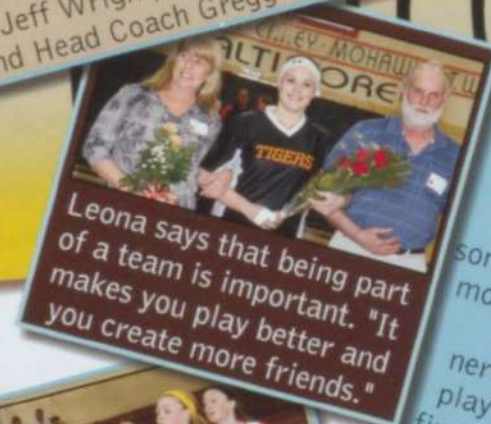

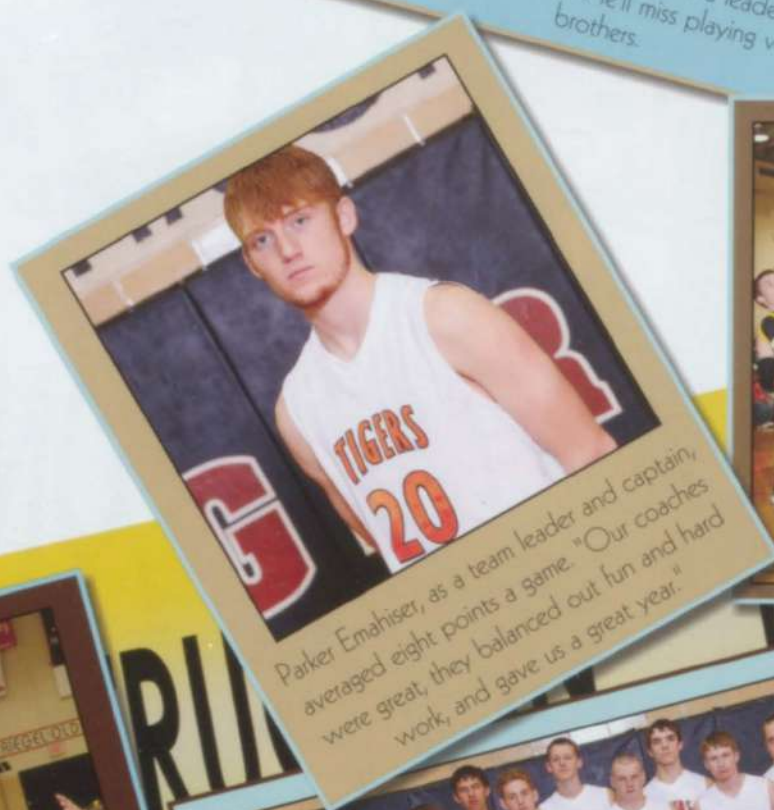
TEARING UP THE WOOD WORK

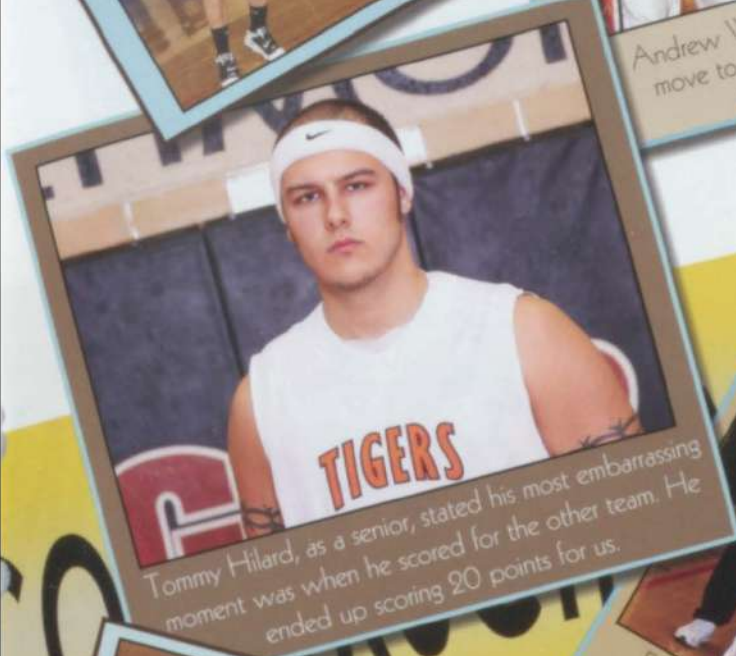

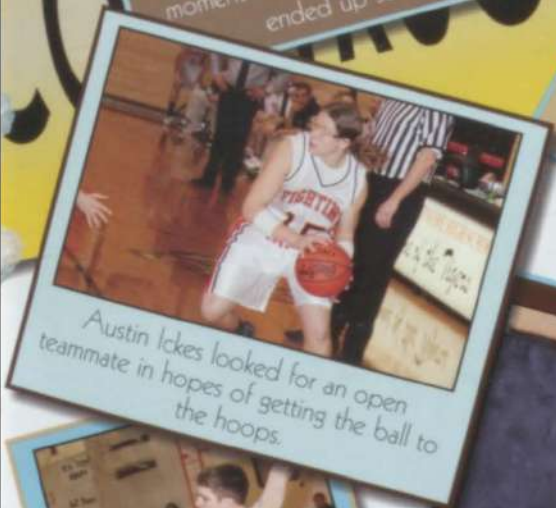

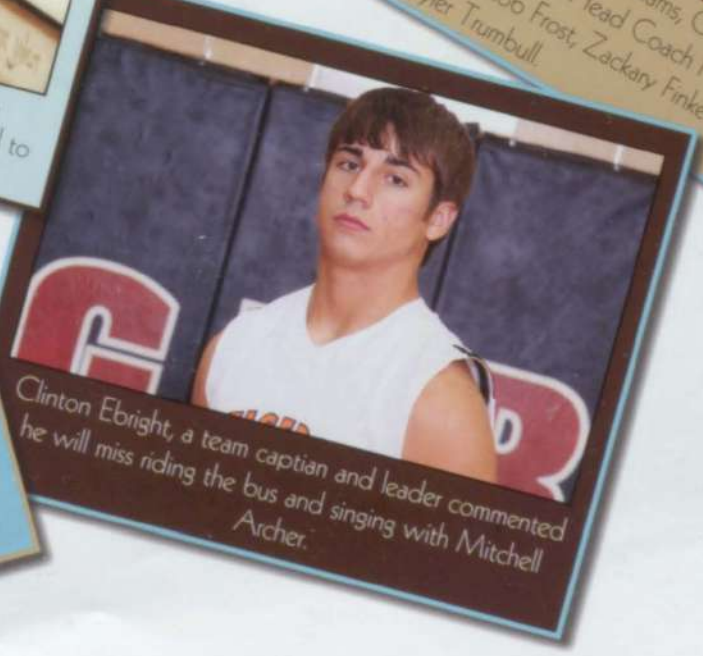

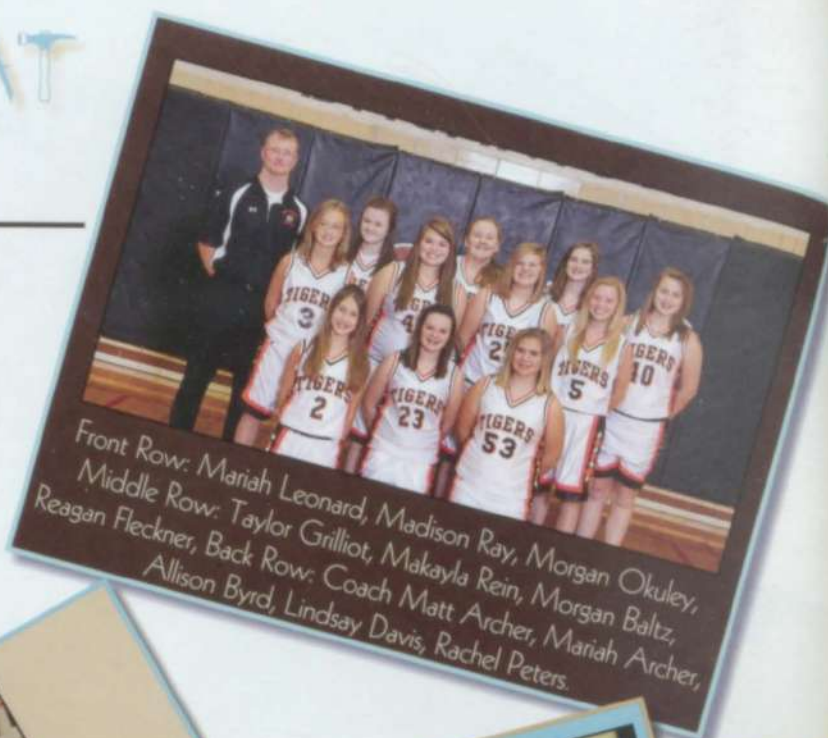

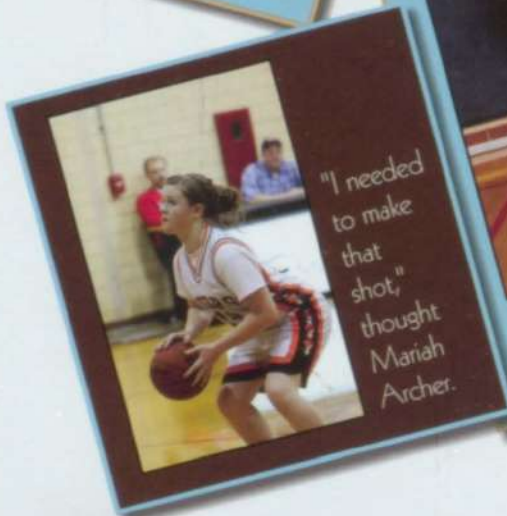

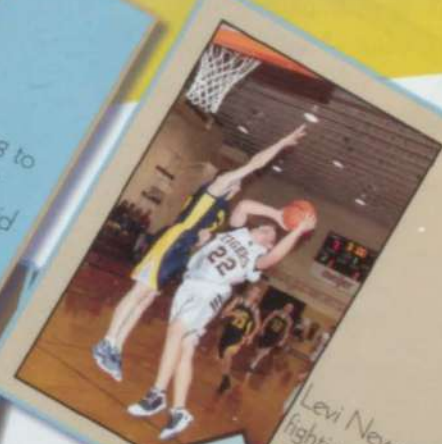

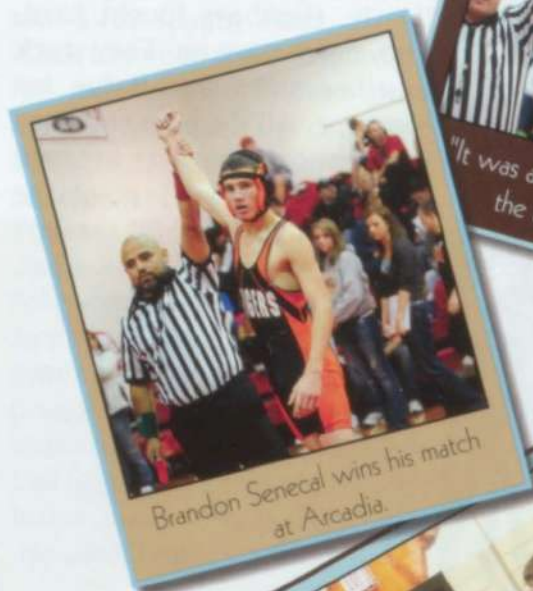

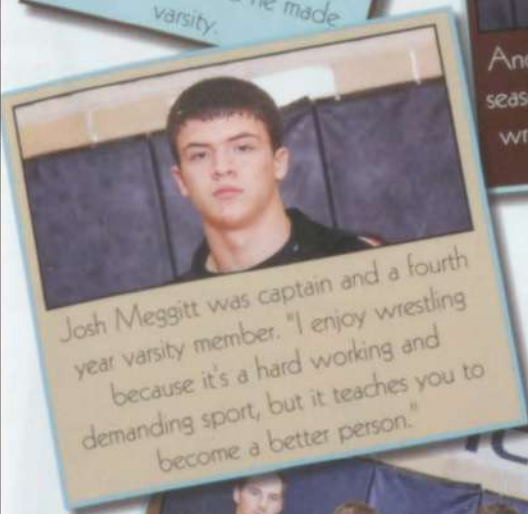

"I enjoy wrestling because it gets me stronger and in shape for track," said Andrew Senecal, a second year varsity wrestler.

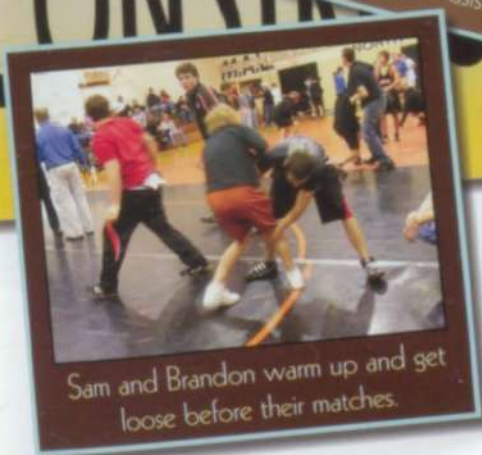




DEVELOPING THE MOVEMENT

HARD WORK AND GOOD ATTITUDE


