"I signed up for Computer Applications so I could learn to use my computer better," said Elizabeth Ebersole.



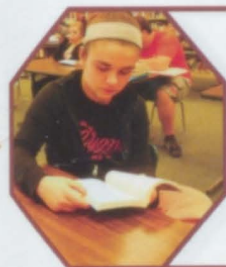

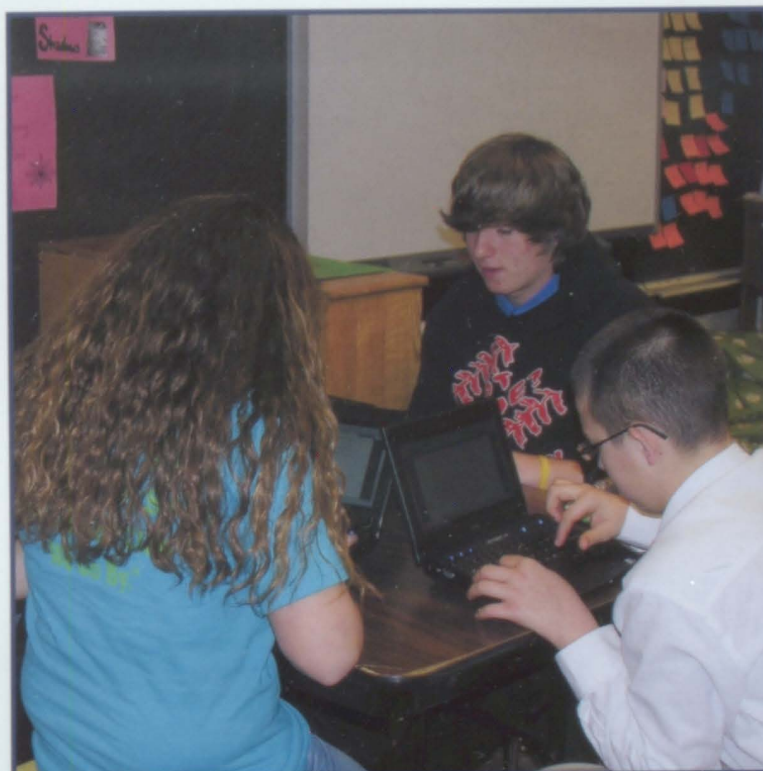

"Mr. Lamb does an awesome job teaching the subject," said Morgan Sams.



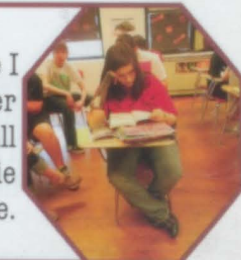
"It is important to take Algebra I so I can pay bills and make sure I'm paying the right amount of money," said Ahshawlee Lindquist.
