The cast all had their favorite

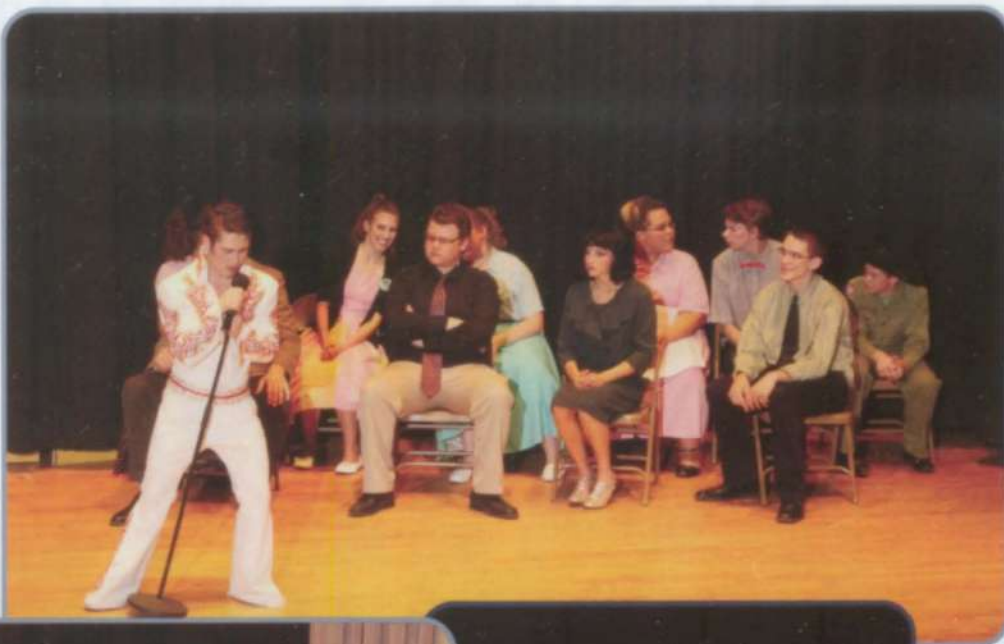
scenes from the musical. Ms.

A Trip Worth Taking

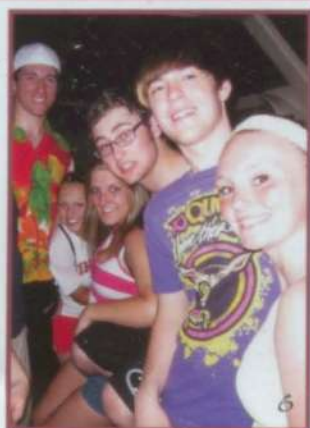
The band trip to Disney was educational, fun, and definitely a great experience.

"My favorite song I danced to was 'Shout' because it reminded me of the movie 'Wedding Crashers'," said Joel Swartz.



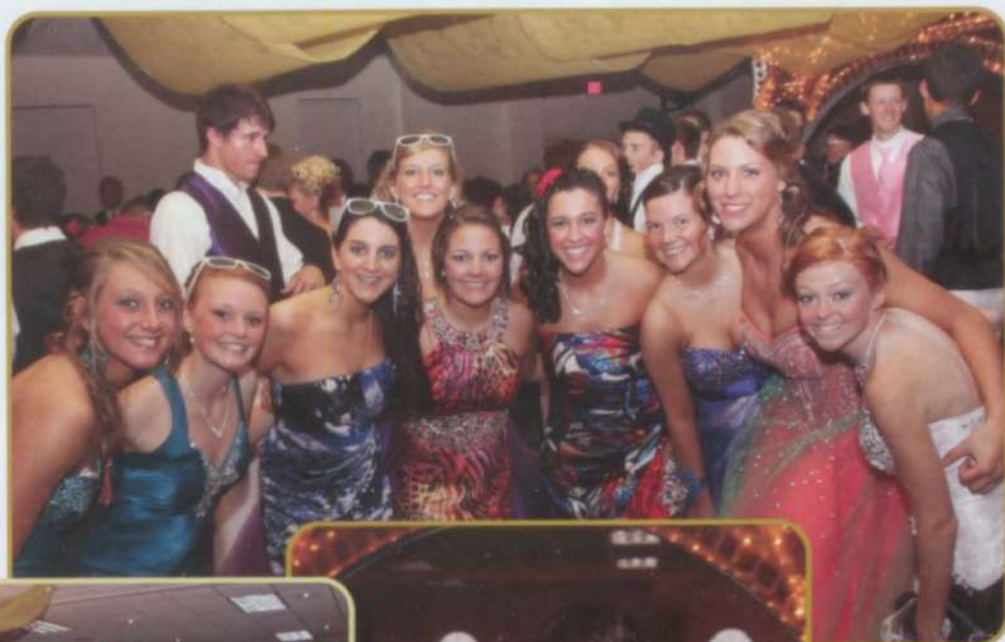
