



11 "I had the best time at the dance. It was Hawaiian Lual and I limboed, breakdanced, and danced obviously," said Anousanh Ornpaeng.



14] "The blood drive went all right except I got dizzy a lot. I love helping out so I decided to participate in the blood drive," said





1] "I was inspired to take Publications because I thought the class would be fun. My favorite part of the year is at the end of the year when the book comes together," said Caleigh Pryor.









3] "I thought that Publications could give me a opportunity to create history for the school," said Christian Richmond.

5] "It was an honor to be the only senior working on the senior section of the yearbook. I hope all the seniors have warm thoughts when they














look through all the sections that captured their last year, especially the Senior Section," said Chad Smith, Senior Editor.

4] The North Baltimore American Legion's Color Guard presented flags at the ceremony.







9] "I make myself better by studying and I play because it's fun," said Kiah Powell.


10] "My favorite part of quiz bowl is answering questions and getting them correct. I prepare myself by looking questions up on the computer," said Caleb Donaldson.

11] "I did great in all the matches. I'm going to get a quiz bowl scholarship. I play quiz bowl becuase football seems difficult," said Robert Lyberg.






