"I am pretending to do my NoRedInk. Hopefully Ms. Huffman doesn't see this," said Alex Nichols.



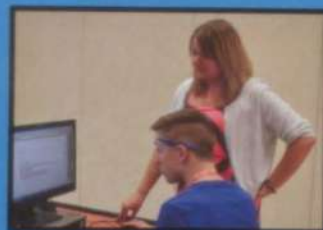

Austin Kepling expressed his feelings about band by stating, "I enjoy band because I love to play the drums and be with my friends".

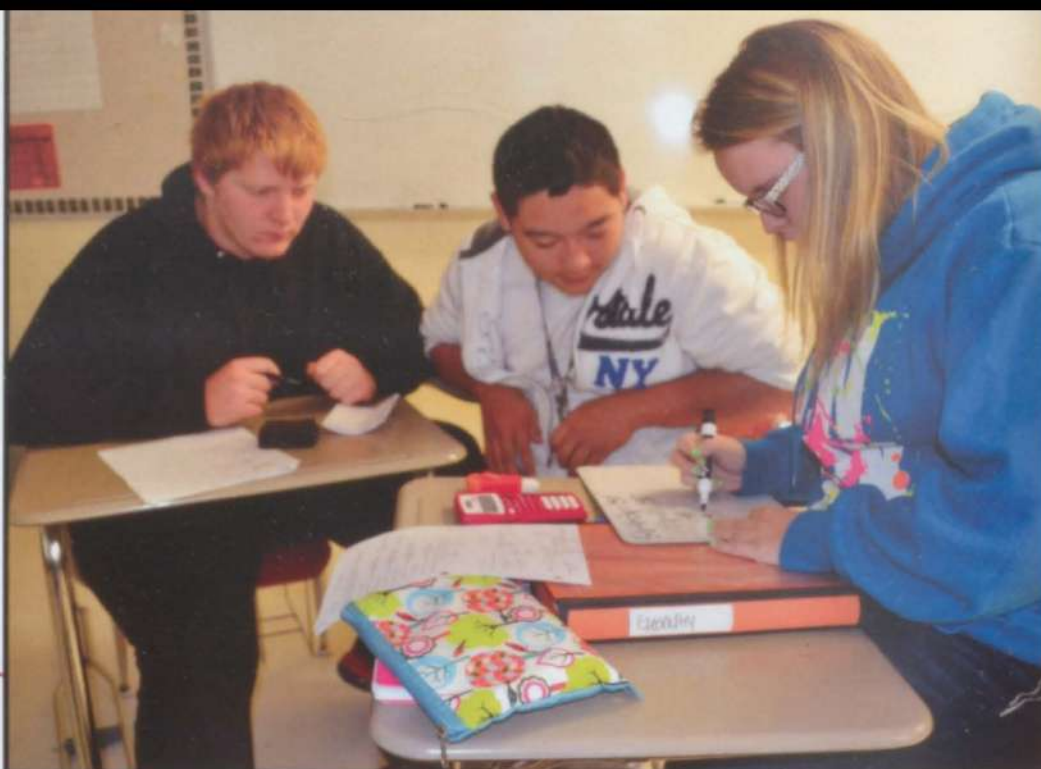
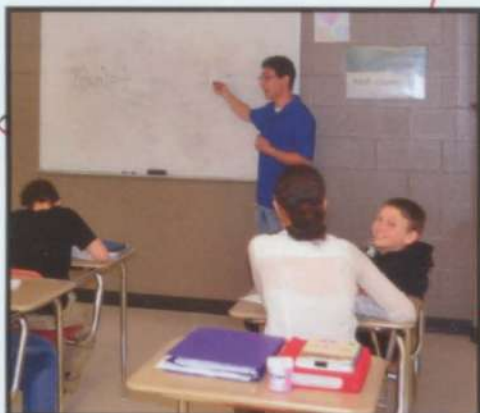

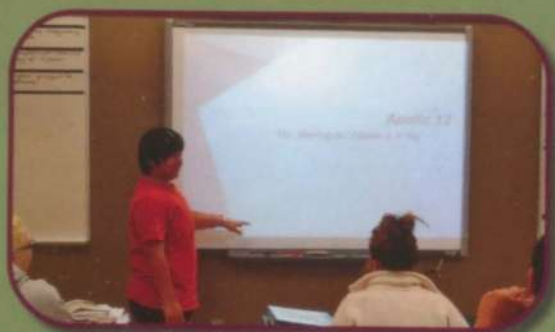
<"I like how laid back health class was. It didn't feel like a class, it was more like we were just talking and sharing opinions," said Hailey Powell, Eighth Grade.
