"My favorite part of the play was the *Song Of Love* because it was a very entertaining and interactive song," said Zoey Beaupry.

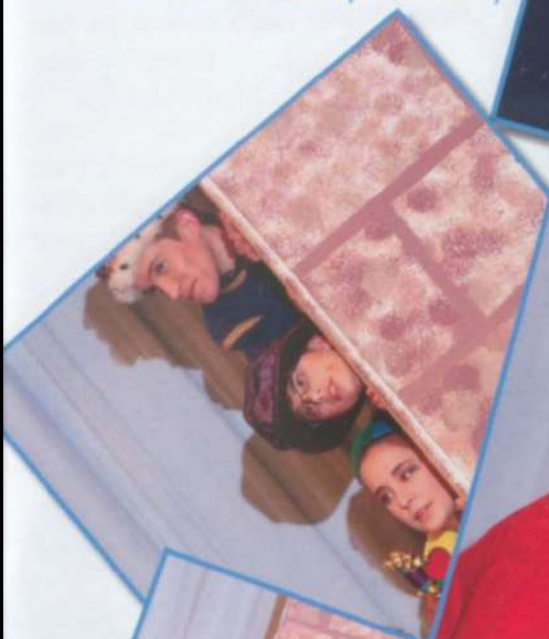
"The scariest part about preforming in front of a crowd was worrying about walking up and down the stairs without tripping or falling," said Kaley McCartney.

"Drama Club is my favorite part of high school and Once Upon a mattress was my favorite musical to perform," said Allison Beaupry.

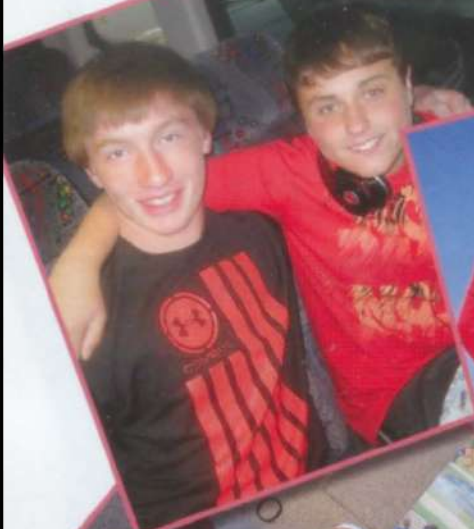


"It was wonderful to work with the other knights and watch the dance fall together for the play," said Billy Trout.

"I liked Prom more because I was closer to people at prom than at fall or winter homecoming," said Lisa Rennau.

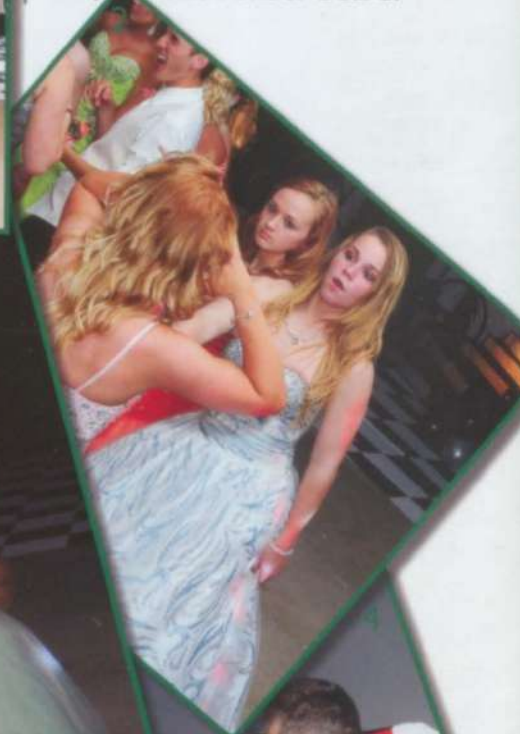

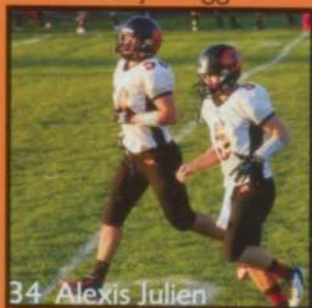
"There was a little rivalry between North Baltimore and Van Buren, because we know most of their football payers," said Zachary Meggitt.

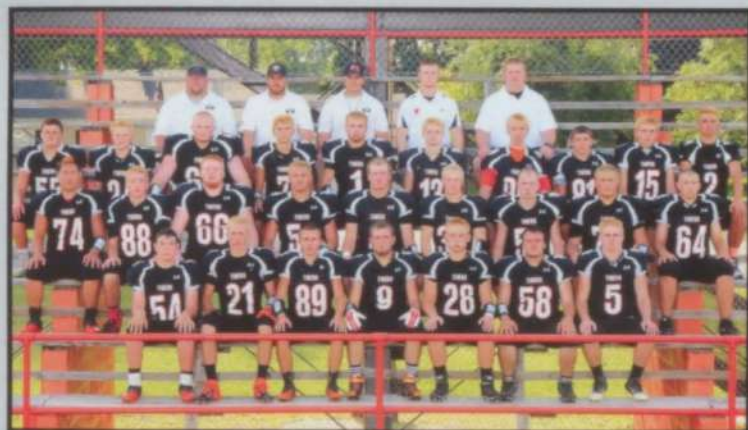

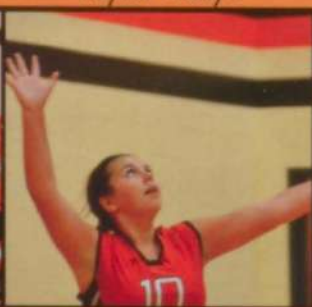
"I think we improved this year and really came together as a team a lot better. I am going to miss playing in our games with all of my teammates," said Morgan Okuley.
