"I decided to participate in track because it's a good way to hang out with my friends after school and because I ran cross country, so I figured I'd like track as well," said Wyatt Mowrey.



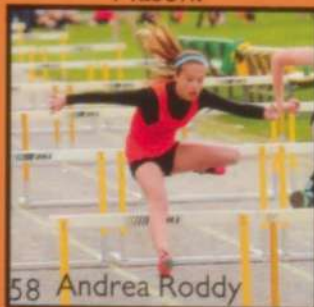
"Every time I run, I think about beating my P.R. and improving myself, I also think about how proud the fans would be if I got a good place and do my best," said Kirsten Mason.

"I'll always remember when I broke the meet record at the Hopewell Invitational because it was really emotional," said Jordan Bucher.

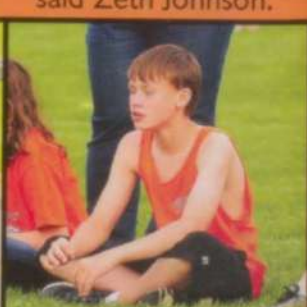
"Wanting to keep breaking my personal records always motivates me to get better," said Kiley Brooker.

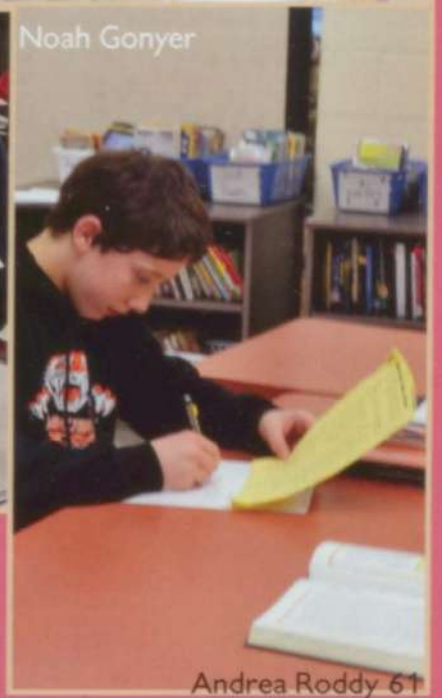

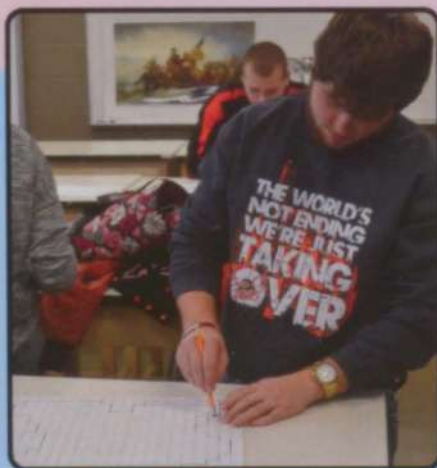
"Art is a way to express your feelings in a creative and visual way. My inspiration for art changes piece by piece because, there is a different theme for each project," said Madison Ray.

"I struggled a lot with the financial unit. I feel like I excelled in my essays, which were about my future career," said Garrett Carles.

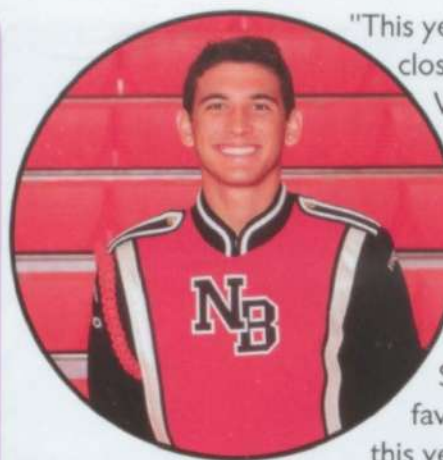


"To me, business class is learning more about the economy and the world. I enjoy working online more than classroom learning because I enjoy being on the computer," said Bryce Gunter.

"I feel like a lot of the concepts we learn are very hard, because I'm not good at math. I try to study hard and get help when I need it though," said Aurelian Greeno.

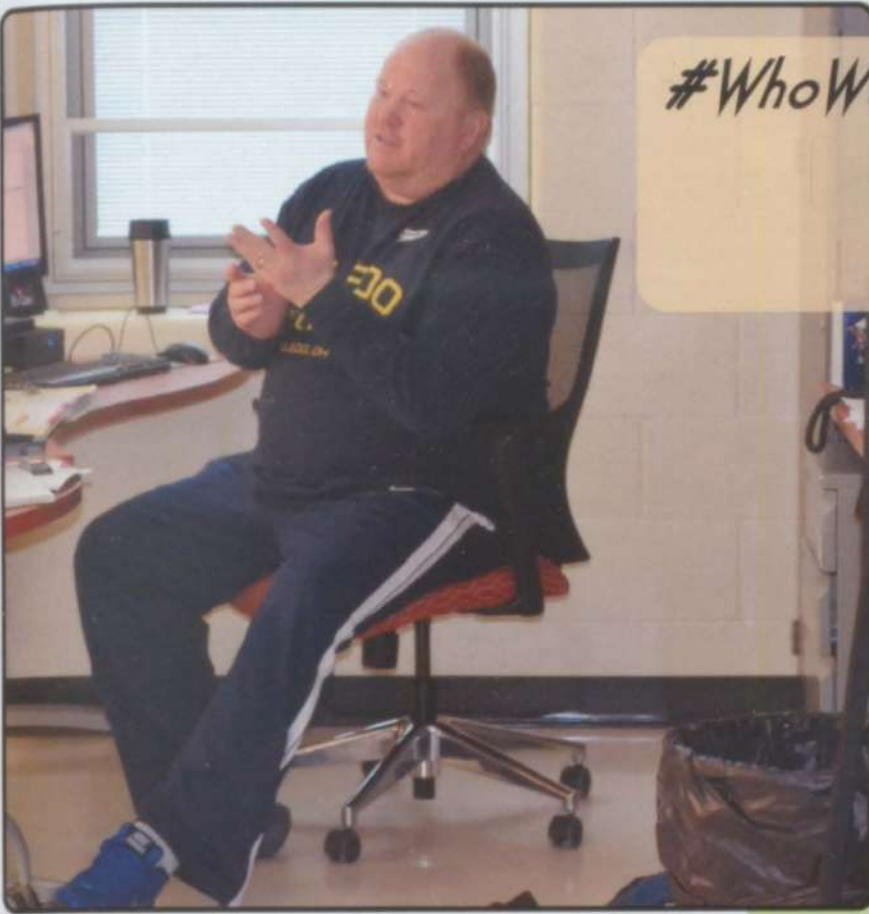
