"The parties we throw for each holiday are the best because we eat and have lots of fun," said Alexis Julien.




"The student life section of the yearbook is my favorite because you get to see some funny pictures of your classmates," said Emily Swope.

"I loved being apart of this year's student council. I love organizing and planning events, especially if it is for a good cause," said Sarina Villegas.








More than Just a Pretty Face
