"I signed up for this class because I have been apart of the staff for the past two years and wanted to keep doing it and the class means a lot to me," said Aurelian Greeno.



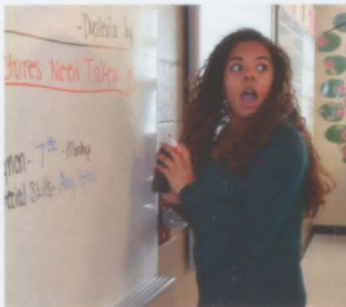

"My favorite part of publications is bonding with people I never thought I would. It is my favorite because I get to meet all kinds of people," said Caleigh Pryor.



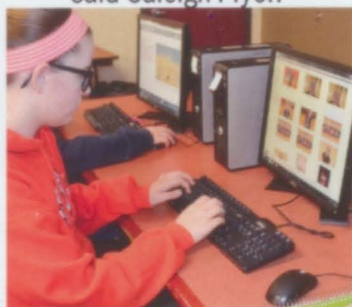
"I really don't like editing my own pages because I hate fixing my own mistakes," said Sarina Villegas.



"I feel one of my strengths in this class is picture taking. I feel as though I'm good at capturing action shots," said Jordan Bucher.



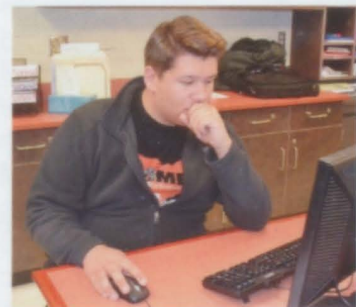
"I have quite the love-hate relationship with publications. I love working as a team, however, sometimes I get overwhelmed with all of the work," said Andrea Roddy.



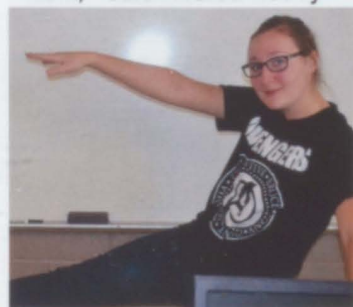
"My favorite part about publications is taking pictures. I've always enjoyed taking pictures," said Hannah Main.

"Taking pictures is my favorite. Getting to see a picture that I took and watch it get put into a book that everyone is going to see is awesome," said Valerie Buchanan.



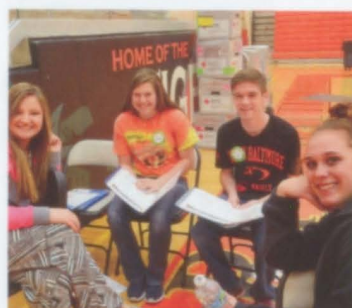
"I take this class because it will be great experience for my future career," said Sarina Villegas.

"I loved having a say in what we do for homecoming. I definitely plan on being a part of student council next year," said Alivia Light.



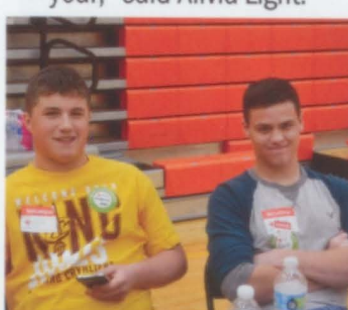
"In student council we are in charge of planning dances, coming up with themes, and battle of the classes," said Cassidy Hiser.

"It was nice to see lots of students being brave enough to give blood," said Zachary Meggitt.



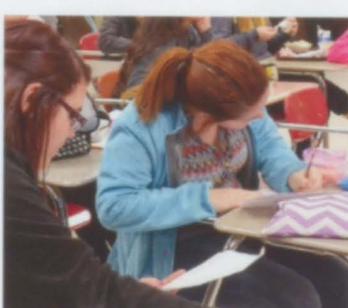
"I had fun working at the blood drive because it was nice to see people from our school donating their blood for a good cause," said Leah Hetrick.

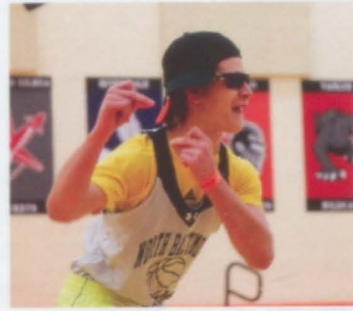
"Homecoming was very enjoyable. I loved dancing and hanging out with my friends," said Cody Gerdeman.

"PJ day is my favorite spirit day because all I had to do was wake up and head right to school," said Seth Thompson.



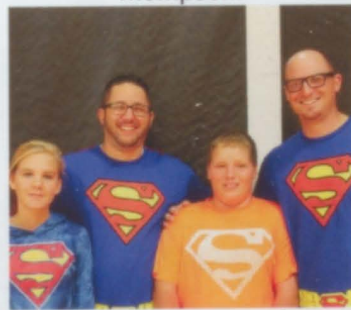
"I chose to participate in the lip syncing contest because I thought it'd be fun and I got really into the song," said Makenna Ray.



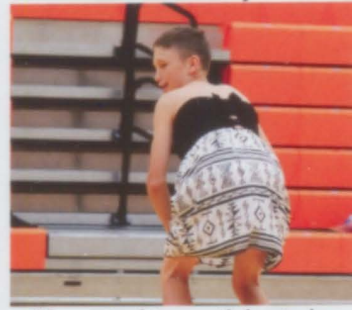
"After accepting my fate, I was glad Eli won. It could have been much worse," said Mr. Lamb.

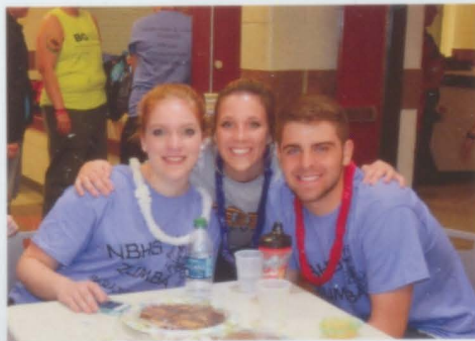
