"My favorite dress up day was Dress like your Kindergarten picture day because we got to dress up like little kids again," said Grace Stanfield.



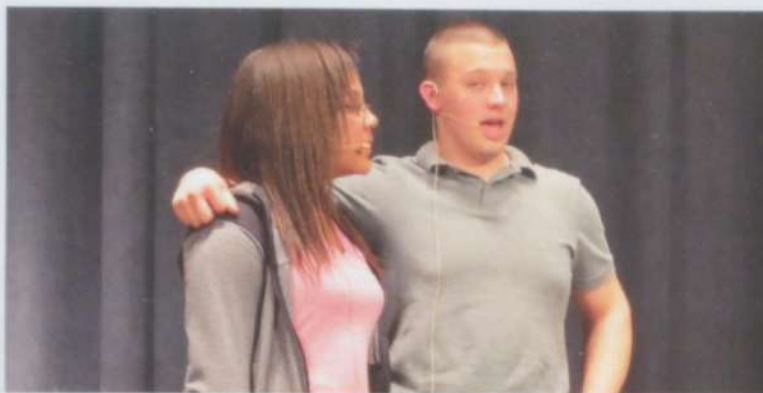
"I wasn't nervous during the homecoming ceremony because everyone in the stands already saw me play, so it was just like playing a basketball game," said Elijah Smith.

"I think it would be great to do another show like this one because it was awesome! It actually was a lot funnier than I expected it to be," said Lily Woods.



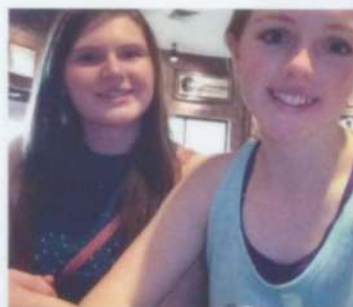

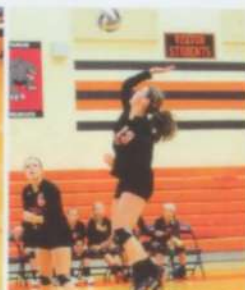
