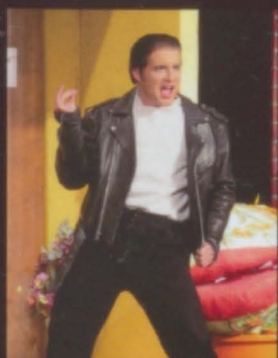
2. "I love how close we all get. We really do become a family during and after the musical. We're one team with one dream. As the saying says 'What club? Drama club!'" said Mali Combs.

4. "This was a very different experience since this was my first time ever doing anything scripted. My favorite part during the entire show was getting my makeup done," said Dalton Teafor.

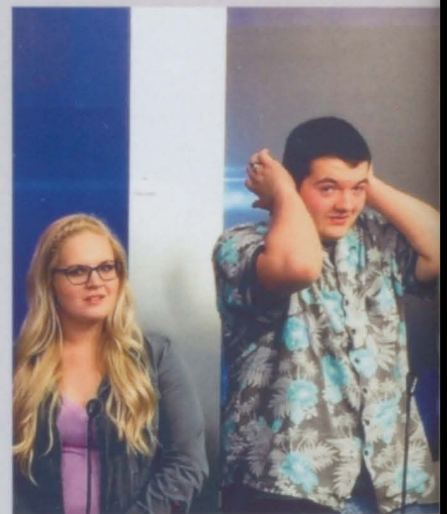

"I look forward to seeing the Publications page completed because I helped make the book and put a lot of hard work into it," said Hannah Swartz.

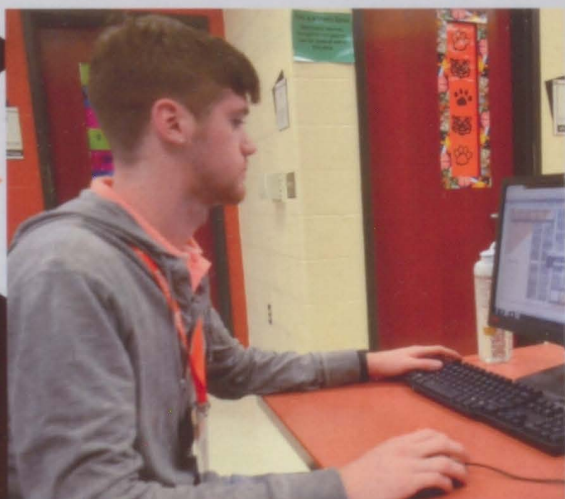


"Hannah inspired me to join Yearbook this year and I thought it would be good for me. I look up to Lydia because she is the head editor," said Emily McDonald.

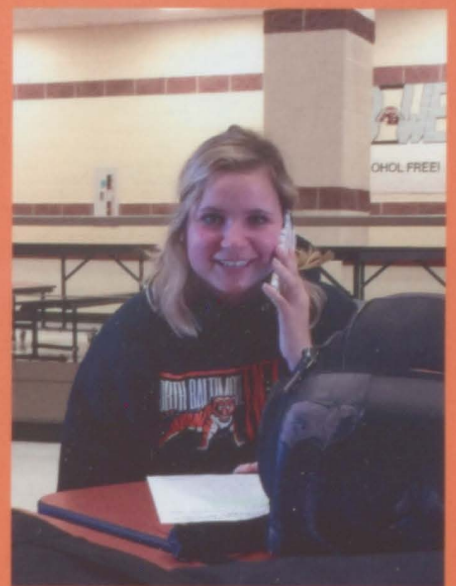

The staff worked with a couple local professional photographers to work on their skills.

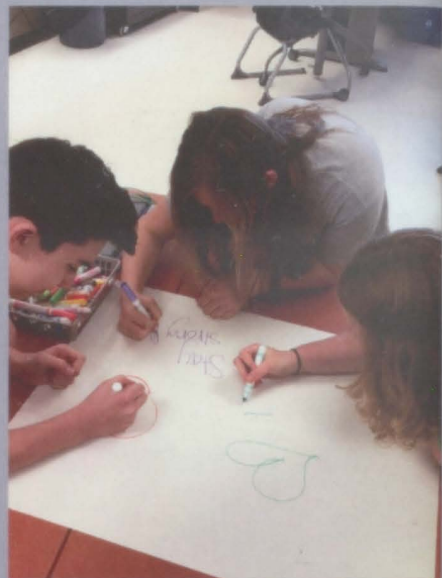
The staff sold a total of 37 ads to place in the yearbook this year.

This is the Drama Clubs 5th Annual Variety Show.

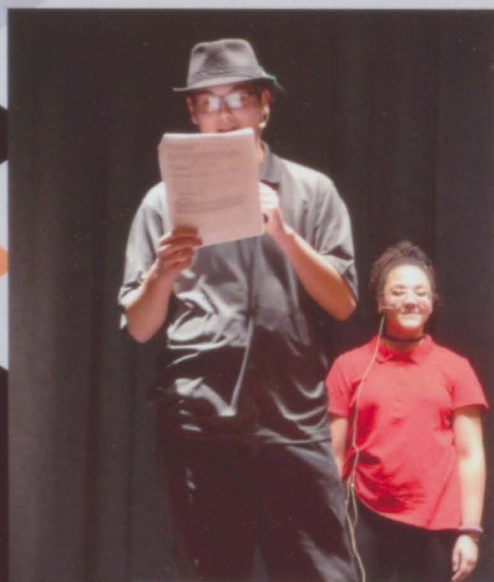
They displayed talents from both the high school and middle school.

4. "It was such a great experience because it allowed me to enjoy doing what I love with my best friends and try new things," said Claudia Ognil-Pedrero.



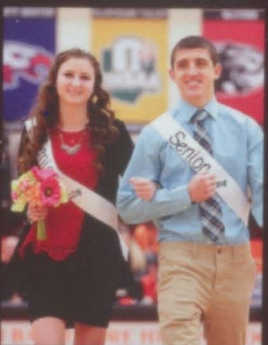
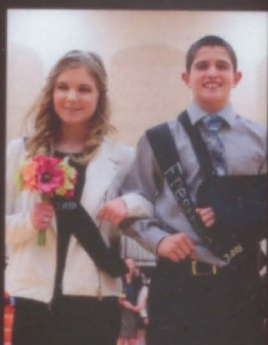

Winter Homecoming took place on January 23rd this year.

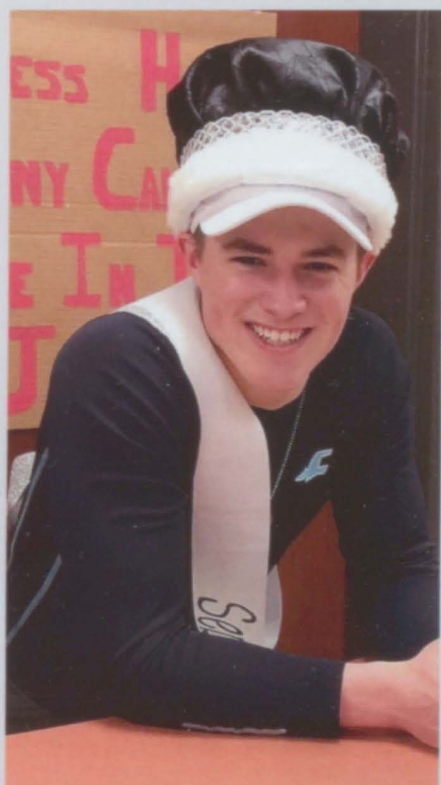
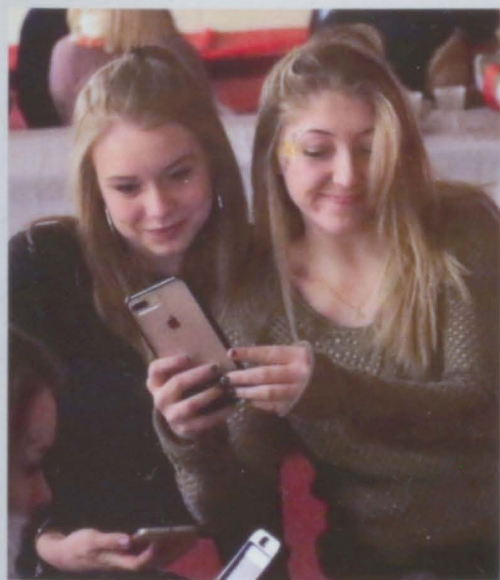
Chase Naugle and Valerie Buchanan were crowned Homecoming King and Queen.

"Prom was a night to remember because I had a lot of fun with my friends," said Zion Cook.

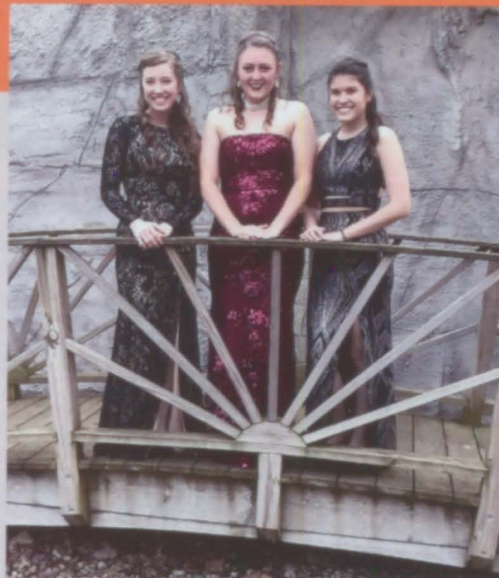
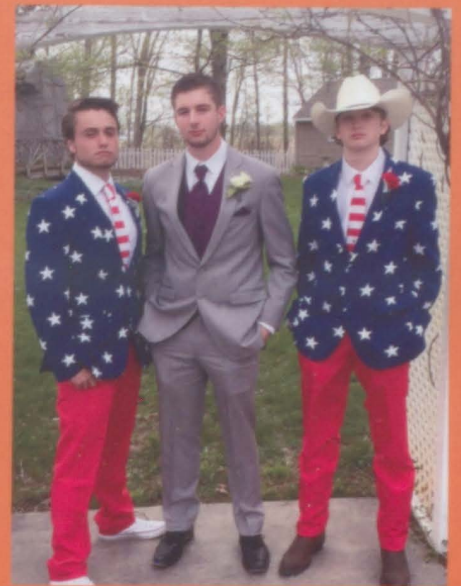
